1 Section 1. Section 601E.6, subsections 1 and 2, Code 1985,
2 are amended to read as follows:

3 1. A handicapped identification device may be displayed in
4 a motor vehicle being used by a handicapped person, either as
5 operator or passenger. The devices shall be of uniform design
6 and fabricated of durable material, suitable for display from
7 within the passenger compartment of a motor vehicle, and
8 readily transferable from one vehicle to another. They shall
9 be acquired by the department and sold at cost, not to exceed
10 five dollars, to handicapped persons upon application on forms
11 prescribed by the department. Before delivering a handicapped
12 identification device to a purchaser, the department shall
13 permanently affix to the device a unique number which may be
14 used by the department to identify that individual purchaser.
15 A handicapped registration issued under section 321.34,
16 subsection 7, is also a valid handicapped identification
17 device. The department shall issue a handicapped
18 identification card to the handicapped person who is issued a
19 handicapped identification device under this section or a
20 handicapped registration under section 321.34, subsection 7.
21 The handicapped identification card shall include the number
22 of the device or registration.

23 2. A city or other political subdivision which provides
24 on-street parking areas or off-street parking facilities shall
25 set aside at least six-tenths of one percent of the metered
26 parking spaces as handicapped parking spaces. A person may
27 also set aside handicapped parking spaces on the person's
28 property provided each parking space is clearly and
29 prominently designated as a handicapped parking space.

30 PARAGRAPH DIVIDED. The use of a handicapped parking space
31 by a motor vehicle not displaying a handicapped identification
32 device, or by a motor vehicle displaying such a device but not
33 being used by a handicapped person, as operator or passenger
34 who has in immediate possession a handicapped identification
35 card, is a misdemeanor for which a fine may be imposed upon

1 the owner, operator, or lessee of the motor vehicle. A
2 handicapped person is not required to have in immediate
3 possession a handicapped identification card if the
4 handicapped identification device displayed on the vehicle has
5 been issued by another state. The operator of a motor vehicle
6 displaying a handicapped identification device issued pursuant
7 to section 601E.6, subsection 3, paragraph "d", who is
8 transporting a handicapped person may use a handicapped
9 parking space if the operator has in immediate possession a
10 handicapped identification card issued under section 601E.6,
11 subsection 3, paragraph "d". The fine for each violation is
12 fifteen dollars. However, a handicapped person charged with
13 violating this subsection for not possessing a handicapped
14 identification card shall not be convicted if the person
15 produces in court, within a reasonable time, a handicapped
16 identification card which was valid at the time of the
17 person's arrest. Proof of conviction of three or more
18 violations involving improper use of the same handicapped
19 identification device is grounds for revocation by the
20 department of the holder's privilege to use the device.

22 Code 1985, are amended to read as follows:

23 a. Establishing procedure for applying to the department
24 for issuance of a permanent or temporary handicapped
25 identification device under this section and establishing

28 d. Establishing procedure and proof requirements for
29 application to the department for issuance of a handicapped
30 identification device and handicapped identification cards to
31 nonhandicapped individuals, government agencies, or private
32 organizations which are engaged in providing transportation
33 services for handicapped persons.

34 Sec. 3. Section 2 of this Act takes effect July 1

35 following its enactment and section 1 of this Act takes effect

1 January 1 following its enactment.

2 EXPLANATION

3 This bill provides for the issuance of handicapped iden-
4 tification cards to persons who have been issued handicapped
5 identification devices or registrations. A motor vehicle dis-
6 playing a handicapped identification device may not park in a
7 handicapped parking space unless the vehicle is being used to
8 transport a handicapped person who has in immediate possession
9 a handicapped identification card. The identification card is
10 not required for vehicles displaying handicapped identifi-
11 cation devices issued by another state. Individuals, govern-
12 ment agencies, and private organizations who have been issued
13 handicapped identification cards may substitute these cards
14 for those issued to handicapped persons. Similar to section
15 321.174 regarding possession of a license, this bill provides
16 that a handicapped person charged with parking while not
17 possessing a handicapped identification card will not be
18 convicted if the person produces in court, within a reasonable
19 time, a handicapped identification card which was valid at the
20 time of arrest.

21 This bill allows the department of transportation time to
22 promulgate rules for the issuance of handicapped
23 identification cards from July 1 following enactment, but the
24 criminal provisions do not take effect until January 1
25 following enactment.

7. Handicapped plates. The owner of a motor vehicle subject to registration pursuant to section 321.109, subsection 1, light delivery truck, panel delivery truck or pickup who is a handicapped or paraplegic person as defined in section 601E.1, may upon written application to the department, order special registration plates designed by the department bearing the international symbol of accessibility. The special registration plates shall only be issued if the application is accompanied with a statement from a physician licensed under chapter 148, 150, or 150A, written on the physician's stationery, stating the nature of the applicant's handicap and such additional information as required by rules adopted by the department. The application shall be approved by the department and the special registration plates shall be issued to the applicant in exchange for the previous registration plates issued to the person. The fee for the special plates shall be five dollars which shall be in addition to the regular annual registration fee. The department shall validate the special plates in the same manner as regular registration plates are validated under this section at the regular annual registration fee. However, the special plates shall not be renewed without the applicant furnishing evidence to the department that the owner of the motor vehicle is still a handicapped or paraplegic person as defined in section 601E.1. The special registration plates

shall be surrendered in exchange for regular registration plates when the owner of the motor vehicle no longer qualifies as a handicapped or paraplegic person as defined in section 601E.1.

The handicapped identification stickers shall bear the international symbol of accessibility. The handicapped identification stickers shall be acquired by the department and sold at cost, not to exceed five dollars, to eligible handicapped persons upon application on forms prescribed by the department.

Sec. 8. Sections 2 and 3 take effect January 1, 1987. Section 6 takes effect July 1, 1986, and with regard to the interval for persons to furnish evidence of their physical handicap applies to temporary handicapped identification devices issued on or after July 1, 1986.
