RELATED TO THE APPOINTMENT OF COUNTY DEPUTIES, ASSISTANTS,
AND CLERKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 331.903, subsection 1, Code 1985, is amended to read as follows:

1. The auditor, treasurer, recorder, sheriff, and county attorney may each appoint, with approval of the board, one or more deputies, assistants, or clerks who do not hold another county office and for whose acts the principal officer is responsible. The number of deputies, assistants, and clerks for each office shall be determined by the board and the
