A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to combined hunting, fishing, and fur harvesting
2 licenses.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 2032

1 Section 1. Section 110.1, Code 1985, is amended by adding
2 the following new subsection:

3 NEW SUBSECTION. 3A. Hunting, fishing, and fur harvesting
4 combined licenses:

5 a. Annual license for residents except as other-
6 wise provided \$25.00

7 b. Lifetime license for residents permanently
8 disabled or sixty-five years of age or older \$25.00

9 EXPLANATION

10 This bill authorizes a combined hunting, fishing, and fur
11 harvesting license with a fee below the total of the fees if
12 each license was acquired separately.

 23 the wildlife habitat stamps shall be used within the
 24 state of Iowa for habitat development and shall be
 25 deposited in the state fish and game protection fund.
 26 The revenue may be used for the matching of federal
 27 funds. The revenues and any matched federal funds
 28 shall be used for acquisition of land, leasing of land
 29 or obtaining of easements from willing sellers for use
 30 as wildlife habitats. Notwithstanding the exemption
 31 provided by section 427.1, any land acquired with the
 32 revenues and matched federal funds shall be subject to
 33 the full consolidated levy of property taxes which
 34 shall be paid from those revenues. In addition such
 35 revenue may be used for the development and
 36 enhancement of wildlife lands and habitat areas. Not
 37 less than fifty percent of all revenue from the sale
 38 of wildlife habitat stamps shall be used by the
 39 commission to enter into agreements with county
 40 conservation boards or other public agencies in order
 41 to carry out the purposes of this section. The state
 42 share of funding of those agreements provided by the
 43 revenue from the sale of wildlife habitat stamps shall
 44 not exceed seventy-five percent.

47 110.5 FUR HARVESTER LICENSE.

48 A fur harvester license or fur, fish and game

FISCAL NOTE

REQUESTED BY REPRESENTATIVE SULLIVAN

In compliance with a written request received February 13, 1986, a fiscal note for AMENDMENT H-5032 TO HF 2032 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

AMENDMENT H-5032 TO HOUSE FILE 2032 authorizes a combined hunting, fishing, and fur harvesting license with a fee of \$28.50.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Currently, adults who hunt, fish and trap pay a total of \$31 annually for licenses (\$15.50 for a combination hunting and fishing license and \$15.50 for a fur harvesters license). House File 2032 would establish a fee of \$28.50 for a combined hunting, fishing, and fur harvesters license to be paid annually.
2. In 1985, 23,000 adult fur harvester licenses were sold. Of these 23,000 trappers, it is estimated that 70% also hunt and fish and would purchase a combined license (at \$28.50) rather than separate licenses (at \$31)
3. License printing costs are estimated to total \$2,100.

FISCAL EFFECT: The cost of the proposed law, in terms of reduced hunting, fishing, and fur harvesting license receipts and printing costs, is \$42,350. Some of this cost may be offset by people buying a combination license who otherwise would not have purchased separate licenses.
