REQUESTED BY REPRESENTATIVE GROTH

In compliance with a written request received February 7, 1985, a fiscal note for HOUSE FILE 210 REVISED is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 210 increases the weighting from one-tenth (0.1) to five-tenths (0.5) for pupils participating in shared programs between schools or between school districts and merged area schools for the 1986-87 school year.

FISCAL EFFECT: By increasing the weighting of shared pupils, it is estimated that the state's obligation would increase by \$1.2 million for the 1986-87 school year:

FTE shared time pupils and teachers, FY '85	x 148.6

State foundation level	x 80%
Cost attributable to 0.1 weighting	\$ 297,200

This estimate assumes that the FTE number of shared time pupils and teachers remains the same from the present school year to the 1986-87 school year. (LS8 1783H.2, RJH)

RELATING TO THE WEIGHTING PER PUPIL FOR SHARED PROGRAMS OF
SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 442.39, subsection 2, Code 1985, is amended to read as follows:

2. Pupils attending classes in another school district or an area school, attending classes taught by a teacher who is employed jointly under section 280.15, or attending classes taught by a teacher who is employed by another school district, are assigned a weighting of one plus one-tenth five tenths times the percent of the pupil's school day during which the pupil attends classes in another district or area school, attends classes taught by a teacher who is jointly employed under section 280.15, or attends classes taught by a teacher who is employed by another school district if the school budget review committee certifies to the state comptroller that the shared classes or teachers would otherwise not be implemented without the assignment of additional weighting. However, in lieu of the additional weighting of five tenths, the school budget review committee shall assign an additional weighting of one tenth times the percent of the pupil's schoolday in which a pupil attends classes in another district or an area school, attends classes taught by a teacher who is employed jointly under section 280.15, or attends classes taught by a teacher who is employed by another district, in districts that have a substantial number of students in any of grades seven through twelve sharing more than one class or teacher.

Sec. 2. Notwithstanding section 1 of this Act, for the budget year beginning July 1, 1986 only, the state comptroller

shall determine the state aid required to finance the cost of the additional weighting provided in section 1 of this Act. If the state aid required to meet section 1 of this Act exceeds two million dollars, the state comptroller shall reduce the weights proportionally so that the state aid paid under section 1 of this Act does not exceed two million dollars.

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect for computations required for payment of state aid and levying of property taxes under the state school foundation program for the school year beginning July 1, 1986.
