FISCAL NOTE

REQUESTED BY REPRESENTATIVE HALVORSON of Webster

In compliance with a written request received February 4, 1986, a fiscal note for HOUSE FILE 2225 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2225 eliminates the requirement that a school census be conducted once every two years. The proposal also changes the basis for distributing the interest from the permanent school fund from the number of persons of school age to the certified enrollments of school districts and approved nonpublic schools.

Fiscal Effect: The proposal may provide for a reduction in expenditures if a school district chooses not to conduct the school census. Nevertheless, no significant shift in apportioned funds is expected.

RELATING TO THE APPORTIONMENT OF THE INTEREST FROM THE PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND, INCLUDING AN ELIMINATION OF SCHOOL CENSUS REQUIREMENTS, AND PROVIDING THAT THE ACT TAKES EFFECT UPON ITS PUBLICATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 8.6, subsection 9, Code Supplement 1985, is amended to read as follows:

9. APPORTIONMENT OF INTEREST. To apportion the interest of the permanent school fund on the first Monday of March of each year, among the area education agencies of this state in ~~proportion to the number of persons between five and twenty-one years of age in each, as shown by the last report filed with the state comptroller by the commissioner of public instruction as provided in section 302.13.~~

On the first Monday of March annually, the state comptroller shall apportion the interest of the permanent school fund among the area education agencies in this state, in proportion to the number of persons of school age resident pupils who were enrolled in local school districts and approved nonpublic schools in each area education agency, as ~~shown by the report of the commissioner of public instruction, as provided by section 257.18, subsection 17~~ on the second Friday of September of the budget year as provided in sections 442.4 and 442.27.
