2 fund to the state department of transportation for the fiscal
3 year beginning July 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1986 the sum
4 of three hundred seventy-two thousand eight hundred twenty-
5 three (372,823) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary,
6 to provide salary adjustments required by implementation
7 action taken under 1984 Iowa Acts, chapter 1314.

8 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the primary road fund
9 to the state department of transportation for the fiscal year
