1 Section 1. Section 110.27, subsections 1 and 2, Code 1985,
2 are amended to read as follows:

3 1. A hunting license shall not be issued to a person born
4 after January 1, 1967 by the commission, a county recorder, or
5 a depositary authorized to issue hunting licenses, unless the
6 person exhibits a certificate showing satisfactory completion
7 of a hunter safety and ethics education course approved by the
8 commission or a hunting license issued by this state after
9 July 1, 1983. A certificate of completion from an approved
10 hunter safety education course shall not be issued to any a
11 person under twelve years of age. A certificate of completion
12 from an approved hunter safety and ethics education course
13 issued in this state since 1960, by another state, or by a
14 province of Canada, is valid for the requirements of this
15 section, provided the applicant is twelve years of age or
16 older.

17 2. A certificate of completion shall not be issued to a
18 person who has not satisfactorily completed a minimum of eight
19 ten hours of training in an approved hunter safety and ethics
20 education course. The commission shall establish the
21 curriculum for the first ~~eight~~ ten hours of an approved hunter
22 safety and ethics education course offered in this state.
23 Upon completion of the ~~eight-hour~~ ten-hour curriculum, a
24 certificate of completion shall be awarded to the applicant.
25 An examination shall not be required for the award of the
26 certificate.

27 EXPLANATION

28 This bill allows a person to exhibit a hunting license is-
29 sued after the hunter safety certificate requirement became
30 effective instead of the certificate of completion for the
31 hunter safety education course when applying for a hunting
32 license. This bill also increases from eight to ten the
33 number of hours a course must last to be approved.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 110.27, subsections 1 and 2, Code 1985,
are amended to read as follows:

1. A hunting license shall not be issued to a person born
after January 1, 1967 by the commission, a county recorder, or
a depository authorized to issue hunting licenses, unless the
person exhibits a certificate showing satisfactory completion
of a hunter safety and ethics education course approved by the
commission or a hunting license issued by this state after
July 1, 1983. A certificate of completion from an approved
hunter safety education course shall not be issued to any a
person under twelve years of age. A certificate of completion
from an approved hunter safety and ethics education course
issued in this state since 1960, by another state, or by a
province of Canada, is valid for the requirements of this
section, provided the applicant is twelve years of age or
older.

2. A certificate of completion shall not be issued to a
person who has not satisfactorily completed a minimum of eight
ten hours of training in an approved hunter safety and ethics
education course. The commission shall establish the
curriculum for the first eight ten hours of an approved hunter
safety and ethics education course offered in this state.
Upon completion of the eight-hour ten-hour curriculum, a
certificate of completion shall be awarded to the applicant.

An examination shall not be required for the award of the
certificate.
