1 An Act relating to the calculation of enrollment for increasing  
2 enrollment school districts and providing that the Act takes  
3 effect upon its publication.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 442.4, subsection 3, paragraph a, Code  
2 1985, is amended by striking the paragraph and inserting in  
3 lieu thereof the following:

4 a. Twenty-five percent of the highest basic enrollment for  
5 a budget year commencing with the budget year beginning July  
6 1, 1979.

7 Sec. 2. Section 442.28, unnumbered paragraphs 1 and 2,  
8 Code 1985, are amended to read as follows:

9 If a district's actual enrollment for the budget year,  
10 determined under section 442.4, is higher than its budget  
11 enrollment for the budget year, the district is entitled to an  
12 advance from the state of an amount equal to its district cost  
13 per pupil less the amount per pupil for special education  
14 support services, computed as a part of district cost under  
15 the provisions of section 442.7 for the budget year multiplied  
16 by the difference between the actual enrollment for the budget  
17 year and the budget enrollment for the budget year. However,  
18 if a district's actual enrollment for the budget year is more  
19 than fifteen percent higher than its basic enrollment for the  
20 budget year, the advance shall be calculated using seventy-  
21 five percent of the difference between the district's actual  
22 enrollment for the budget year and its basic enrollment for  
23 the budget year. The advance shall be miscellaneous income.

24 If a district receives an advance under this section for a  
25 budget year, the state comptroller shall determine the amount  
26 of the advance which would have been met by local property tax  
27 revenues if the actual enrollment for the budget year or the  
28 budget enrollment for the budget year plus seventy-five

11 takes effect for computations required for state aid and  
12 property tax for school districts for the school year  
13 beginning July 1, 1985.

14 EXPLANATION

15 This bill changes the formula for calculating budget  
16 enrollment of certain increasing enrollment school districts  
17 and allows districts to count one fourth of their highest  
18 basic enrollment.

19 It changes the method for calculating the advance for  
20 school districts that experience more than a 15 percent  
21 increase in enrollment from one school year to the next.  
22 Instead of using the difference between the actual enrollment  
23 for the budget year and the budget enrollment for the budget  
24 year, three fourths of the difference between the budget  
25 enrollment for the budget year and the basic enrollment for  
26 the budget year is added to the budget enrollment for the  
27 budget year. The bill is retroactive to March 1, 1985 and  
28 takes effect for the school year beginning July 1, 1985 upon  
29 its publication.
