FISCAL NOTE

REQUESTED BY REPRESENTATIVE OLLIE

In compliance with a written request received January 9, 1985, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House File 87 pursuant to Joint Rule 16. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau, to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 87 relates to the payment of semi-annual apportionment (fine) monies under section 302.3 of the Code of Iowa to school districts which qualify for the 102 percent budget guarantee. The bill provides that when calculating the budget guarantee of 102 percent for the 1985-86 school year, the state comptroller will add the school fine money into the district cost per pupil for the 1984-85 school year so that districts will receive a two percent increase in their budgets.

FISCAL EFFECT: Under the provisions of House File 87, the cost to the state will increase by \$1.7 million in FY 1986. In FY 1987, semi-annual apportionment monies added into FY 1986 district cost per pupil will grow by two percent, therefore, the state's obligation will increase by approximately \$200,000. Thus, the total cost of House File 87 in FY 1987 would be \$1.9 million.

7 In compliance with a written request a fiscal note for Amendment S-3147 :
8 House File 87 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17.

9
10 Amendment S-3147 amends House File 87 as amended, passed, and reprinted by the House by
11 striking everything after the enacting clause. The amendment pertains to the payment of
12 semi-annual apportionment (fine) monies under section 202.3 of the Code of Iowa, 1983, to
13 school districts which qualify for the 102 percent budget guarantee. Under the provisions
14 of the amendment, fine monies would be added to school districts' controlled budget as a
15 lump sum, so that the 102 percent budget guarantee would not be affected by these
16 additional funds.

17 **FISCAL EFFECT:** The following table illustrates the impact of Amendment S-3147 and House
18 File 87 upon the General Fund:

	House File 87	Amendment S-3147

Increase FY 1987	1.9 million	1.7 million

19 Under House File 87, fine monies are subject to the 102 percent budget guarantee, which
20 will cause the state's obligation to increase during FY 1987 and subsequent fiscal years.
21 By adding fine monies as a lump sum to school district budgets, the state's obligation will
22 not change after the initial increase in FY 1986. (LSB 1597H2. RJH)

RELATING TO THE PROCEDURE FOR ADDING MONEYS IN A SCHOOL DISTRICT'S BUDGET FOR MONEYS COLLECTED UNDER SECTION 302.3, CODE 1981, AND REMOVING THOSE MONEYS FROM THE ONE HUNDRED TWO PERCENT BUDGET GUARANTEE FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1985 AND SUCCEEDING SCHOOL YEARS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 442.7, subsection 7, paragraph i, Code 1985, is amended by striking the paragraph.

Sec. 2. Section 442.9, subsection 1, paragraph b, Code 1985, is amended to read as follows:

b. The district cost for the budget year is equal to the district cost per pupil for the budget year multiplied by the weighted enrollment, plus commencing with the budget year beginning July 1, 1985 additional district cost added for moneys received by a school district under section 302.3, Code 1981, as provided in section 442.21, and plus the additional district cost allocated to the district under section 442.27 to fund media services and educational services provided through the area education agency. A school district may not increase its district cost for the budget year except to the extent that an excess tax levy is authorized by the school budget review committee as provided in section 442.13.

Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 442.21 TEMPORARY SCHOOL FUND.

If the board of directors of a school district certified an amount to the state comptroller to be added to basic allowable growth per pupil for the budget year beginning July 1, 1984 under section 442.7, subsection 7, paragraph "i", Code Supplement 1983, the amount certified shall be added to the district cost of the school district commencing with the budget year beginning July 1, 1985.

Sec. 4. Procedures used and property tax levies calculated by the state comptroller for the budget year beginning July 1, 1984 under section 442.7, subsection 7, paragraph "i", Code Supplement 1983, shall be completed for that budget year.

Sec. 5. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect from and after its publication in the Charles City Press, a newspaper published in Charles City, Iowa, and in the Fayette County Union, a newspaper published in West Union, Iowa for computations required for payment of state aid and levying of property taxes under the state school foundation program for the school year beginning July 1, 1985. However, section 1 of this Act takes effect July 1, 1985.
