1 Section 1. Section 261.2, subsection 4, Code 1985, is
2 amended by striking the subsection and inserting in lieu
3 thereof the following:

4 4. Prepare a plan for a state supported and administered
5 scholarship program. Funds appropriated by the general
6 assembly for the scholarship program shall be allocated by the
7 commission to institutions of higher education under the state
8 board of regents, to the merged area schools, and to
9 accredited private institutions as defined in section 261.9,
10 subsection 5, that have submitted applications to the
11 commission to participate, on the basis of the relative need
12 of the students enrolled in the institution, as determined by
13 the United States department of education. The scholarships
14 shall be granted by participating institutions to deserving
15 Iowa students based upon ability and need.

16 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 261.67 WORK-STUDY PROGRAM.

17 The Iowa college work-study program is established to
18 stimulate and promote the part-time employment of students
19 attending Iowa postsecondary educational institutions who are

30 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 261.70 STUDENT ELIGIBILITY.

31 In order to be eligible, a student must:

32 1. Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United
33 States.

34 2. Be enrolled and making satisfactory academic progress
35 or accepted for enrollment at an eligible postsecondary

1 institution on a half-time or greater basis.

2 3. Demonstrate financial need. A student's need shall be
3 determined on the basis of a need analysis system approved for
4 use under the federal work-study program.

5 4. Have not defaulted on an Iowa guaranteed student loan
6 or on a loan guaranteed by the federal government.

7 Sec. 6. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
8 state to the Iowa college aid commission for the fiscal year
9 beginning July 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1986 the sum of one
10 million (1,000,000) dollars, or as much thereof as necessary,
11 to be used for the Iowa college work-study program.

EXPLANATION

13 This bill relates to the work of the Iowa college aid
14 commission. It changes the administrative procedures for the
15 Iowa scholarship program so that the college aid commission no
16 longer grants the scholarships, but instead allocates an
17 amount to participating institutions and they grant the
18 scholarships. It also establishes a college work-study
19 program, similar to the federal work-study program. The
20 program is administered by the college aid commission and
21 \$1,000,000 is appropriated to it.

AN ACT

RELATING TO PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY THE IOWA COLLEGE AID COMMISSION, TO ESTABLISH AN IOWA COLLEGE WORK-STUDY PROGRAM, AND TO CHANGE THE METHOD OF ADMINISTERING THE STATE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. NEW SECTION. 261.67 WORK-STUDY PROGRAM.

The Iowa college work-study program is established to stimulate and promote the part-time employment of students attending Iowa postsecondary educational institutions who are in need of employment earnings in order to pursue postsecondary education. The program shall be administered by the commission. The commission shall adopt rules under chapter 17A to carry out the program. The employment under the program shall be employment by the postsecondary education institution itself or work in a public agency or private nonprofit organization under a contract between the institution and the agency or organization. The work shall not result in the displacement of employed workers or impair existing contracts for services.

Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 261.68 DUTIES OF COLLEGE AID COMMISSION.

The college aid commission shall:

1. Enter into agreements with eligible postsecondary education institutions for participation in the program.
2. Allocate funds to participating postsecondary education institutions if funds are available to the commission for that purpose.

3. Review reports from participating postsecondary education institutions.

4. Conduct program reviews and audits of participating postsecondary education institutions.

5. Accept gifts, grants, and other aid from public and private persons or agencies.

Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 261.69 DUTIES OF INSTITUTIONS.

An eligible postsecondary education institution is an institution of higher education under the state board of regents, a merged area school, or an accredited private institution as defined in section 261.9, subsection 5. The commission may enter into an agreement with an eligible postsecondary education institution under which the commission will make grants to the institution for the work-study program.

The participating institution shall:

1. File the proper forms with the commission for participation in the program.
2. Develop jobs that meet the requirements of the Iowa college work-study program. To the extent possible, the job should complement the student's educational program and career goal.
3. Supervise and evaluate employment and maintain the records required by the commission.
4. Participate in the federal work-study program.

Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 261.70 STUDENT ELIGIBILITY.

In order to be eligible, a student must:

1. Be a citizen of the United States and a resident of this state.
2. Be enrolled and making satisfactory academic progress or accepted for enrollment at an eligible postsecondary institution on a half-time or greater basis.
3. Demonstrate financial need. A student's need shall be determined on the basis of a need analysis system approved for use under the federal work-study program.

4. Have not defaulted on an Iowa guaranteed student loan or on a loan guaranteed by the federal government.
