4 The bill expands the use of secondary road assessment  
5 districts to include road improvements such as grading, ..  
6 drainage, bridging, paving, and resurfacing. Current law  
7 allows road resurfacing improvements. The bill also raises  
8 the minimum amount to be paid by the property owners from  
9 twenty-five percent to fifty percent. The bill also deletes  
10 the procedure for an appeal by the board of supervisors to the  
11 state department of transportation to determine if the  
12 assessment district should be established because the board of  
13 supervisors have the right to accept or reject the petition  
14 for a district.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 311.1, Code 1985, is amended to read as follows:

311.1 POWER TO ESTABLISH.

In order to provide for the ~~grading, grading, or other suitable surfacing improvements such as grading, draining, bridging, aggregate surfacing, paving, or resurfacing~~ of secondary roads, the board of supervisors ~~shall have power~~ may, on petition, to establish secondary road assessment districts.

Sec. 2. Section 311.3, Code 1985, is amended to read as follows:
