1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 718.7 TRAINING IN THE USE OF 2 WEAPONS OR EXPLOSIVES FOR USE IN CIVIL DISORDER PROHIBITED.

3 1. As used in this section:

a. "Civil disorder" means any public disturbance involving
5 acts of violence which causes an immediate danger of or
6 results in damage or injury to any real or personal property
7 or person.

8 b. "Dangerous weapon" means a dangerous weapon as defined9 in section 702.7.

10 c. "Explosive" means an explosive as defined in section 11 101A.1.

12 d. "Offensive weapon" means an offensive weapon as defined 13 in section 724.1.

14 2. A person shall not:

Teach or demonstrate to any other person the use, 16 application, or manufacture of any dangerous weapon, offensive 17 weapon, explosive, or technique capable of causing injury or 18 death to persons, knowing or having reasonable cause to know 19 and intending that the weapon, explosive, or technique will be 20 unlawfully employed for use in or in furtherance of a civil 21 disorder.

b. Assemble with one or more persons for the purpose of
training with, practicing with, or being instructed in the use
of any dangerous weapon, offensive weapon, explosive, or
technique capable of causing injury or death to persons,
intending to employ the weapon, explosive, or technique
unlawfully for use in or in furtherance of a civil disorder.
A person convicted of a violation of this section is
guilty of a class "D" felony.

## EXPLANATION

11 This bill prohibits the teaching, demonstration, and 12 assembly for training and practice of the use of dangerous 13 weapons, offensive weapons, explosives, or techniques capable 14 of causing injury or death for use in or in the furtherance of 15 a civil disorder. A person convicted of a violation of this 16 section is guilty of a class "D" felony.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. NEW SECTION, 729.5 PROFIBITING VIOLATIONS OF AN INDIVIDUAL'S CIVIL RIGHTS -- PENALTIES.

1. Persons within the state of Towa have the right to be free from any violence, or intimidation by threat of violence, committed against their persons or propercy because of their race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, political affiliation, or sex.

2. A person who conspires with another person or persons to injure, oppress, threaten, or intimidate or interfere with any citizen in the free exercise or enjoyment of any right or privilege secured to that person by the constitution or laws of the state of lowa or by the constitution or laws of the United States, and assembles with one or more persons for the purpose of teaching or being instructed in any technique or means capable of causing property damage, bodily injury or death when the person or persons intend to employ those techniques or means in furtherance of the conspiracy, is on conviction, guilty of a class "D" felony.

3. The fact that a person committed a felony or misdemeanor, or attempted to commit a felony, because of the victim's race, color, religion, nationality, country of origin, political affiliation, or sex, shall be considered a circumstance in aggravation of any crime in imposing sentence.
