1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 256.31 COUNCIL FOR AGRICULTURAL
2 EDUCATION.

3 1. A council for agricultural education is established,
4 which consists of nine members appointed by the governor. The
5 nine members shall include the following:

6 a. Five persons representing all areas of agriculture and
7 diverse geographical areas.

8 b. The individual representing agriculture on the state
9 council for vocational education.

10 c. A secondary school program instructor, a postsecondary
11 school program instructor, and a teacher educator.

12 2. The council may also include as ex officio members the
13 following persons:

14 a. The state future farmers of America president.

15 b. A state future farmers of America alumni president.

16 c. The current postsecondary agriculture students
17 president.

18 d. The current young farmers educational association
19 president.

20 e. A state consultant in agricultural education.

21 f. The secretary of agriculture.

22 g. A member of each house of the general assembly. This
23 membership shall be bipartisan in composition and shall be
24 selected by the majority leader of the senate and the speaker

20 EXPLANATION

FISCAL NOTE

REQUESTED BY REPRESENTATIVE OSTERBERG

In compliance with a written request received March 7, 1988, a fiscal note for HOUSE FILE 2433 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2433 establishes a nine-member council to review, develop, and recommend standards for agricultural education. The standards are to be considered by the Governor, the General Assembly, and the Board of Education. The proposal also permits school districts to develop comprehensive programs for vocational education in agriculture technology and sets minimum standards for such programs. The proposal would require the submission of reports to the bureau of career education and to the agriculture standing committees.

Fiscal Effect:

There would be no fiscal impact to this proposal. Assuming that persons appointed to the council or the organization they represented would be willing to donate their time and expenses, there would be no costs associated with this section of the proposal. The reports related to the vocational agriculture programs would add no additional expense to the Department of Education. Forms for these purposes are already being printed by the Department as worksheets.
