SEQUESTED BY FURESENTATIVE OSTERBERG

In compliance with a written request received March 7, 1988, a fiscal note for HOUSE FILE 2433 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2433 establishes a nine-member council to review, develop, and recommend standards for agricultural education. The standards are to be considered by the Governor, the General Assembly, and the Board of Education. The proposal also permits school districts to develop comprehensive programs for vocational education in agriculture technology and sets minimum standards for such programs. The proposal would require the submission of reports to the bureau of career education and to the agriculture standing committees.

Fiscal Effect:

There would be no fiscal impact to this proposal. Assuming that persons appointed to the council or the organization they represented would be willing to donate their time and expenses, there would be no costs associated with this section of the proposal. The reports related to the vocational agriculture programs would add no additional expense to the Department of Education. Forms for these purposes are already being printed by the Department as worksheets.

The board of directors of each public school district may develop, as part of the curricult in grades nine through twelve, programs for vocational education in agriculture technology.

It is also the intent of the general assembly to endourage the development of programs for vocational education in agriculture technology which are structured on a twell-almonth basis and which include the following:

a. Provision for twe vermonth extended contracts of permit entrepreneurial agricultural experience, summer product planning, and record/emping.

- b. Submission of an annual summer program by each vocational agriculture instructor, employed on an extended contract basis.
- c. The following reports shall be made available to the council for agriculture education upon request:
- (1) A summary of summer activities completed for each vocational agriculture instructor employed on an extended contract.
- (2) A summary of supervised agricultural experience programs conducted during the year in vocational agriculture.
- d. Provision for instructional supervision for agricultural occupational experience programs.
