1 Section 1. Section 18.12, Code Supplement 1987, is amended
2 by adding the following new subsection after subsection 9:
3 NEW SUBSECTION. 9A. On behalf of the department, enter
4 into leases or lease-purchase contracts for real or personal
5 property, wherever located within the state, to be used for
6 buildings, facilities, and structures, or for additions or
7 improvements to existing buildings, facilities, and
8 structures, to carry out the provisions of this chapter or for
9 the proper use and benefit of the state and its state agencies
10 on the following terms and conditions:

11 a. The director shall coordinate the location, design,
12 plans and specifications, construction, and ultimate use of
13 the real or personal property leased or lease-purchased with
14 the state agency for whose benefit and use the property is
15 being obtained and the terms and conditions of the lease or
16 lease-purchase contract with both the state agency for whose
17 benefit and use the property is being obtained and the
18 treasurer of state. Upon awarding the contract for
19 construction of a building or for site development, the
20 director shall have sole authority to administer the contract.

21 b. The lease or lease-purchase contract may provide for
22 ultimate ownership of the property by the state. Title to all
23 property acquired in this manner shall be taken and held in
24 the name of the state. The state shall be the lessee or
25 contracting party under all leases or lease-purchase contracts
26 entered into pursuant to this chapter. The lease or lease-
27 purchase contract may contain provisions similar to provisions
28 customarily found in leases or lease-purchase contracts
29 between private persons, including, but not limited to,
30 provisions prohibiting the acquisition or use by the lessee of
31 competing property or property in substitution for the leased
32 or lease-purchased property, obligating the lessee to pay
33 costs of operation, maintenance, insurance, and taxes relating
34 to the property, and permitting the lessor to retain a
35 security interest in the property leased or lease-purchased,

1 until title passes to the state, which may be assigned or
2 pledged by the lessor. The director may contract for
3 additional security or liquidity for a lease or lease-purchase
4 contract and may enter into agreements for letters of credit,
5 lines of credit, insurance, or other forms of security with
6 respect to rental and other payments due under a lease or
7 lease-purchase contract. Fees for the costs of additional
8 security or liquidity are a cost of entering into the lease or
9 lease-purchase contract and may be paid from funds annually
10 appropriated by the general assembly to the state agency for
11 which the property is being obtained or from other funds
12 legally available. The lease or lease-purchase contract may
13 include the costs of entering into the lease or lease-purchase
14 contract as a cost of the leased or lease-purchased property.
15 The provision of a lease or lease-purchase contract which
16 provides that a portion of the periodic rental payment be
17 applied as interest is subject to chapter 74A. Other laws
18 relating to interest rates do not apply. Chapter 75 does not
19 apply to leases or lease-purchase contracts entered into
20 pursuant to this chapter. Rental and other costs due under
21 leases or lease-purchase contracts entered into pursuant to
22 this chapter shall be payable from funds annually appropriated

14 **EXPLANATION**

15 The bill allows the department of general services to enter
16 into leases or lease-purchase contracts to acquire real or
17 personal property to be used for buildings, facilities, and
18 structures or for additions or improvements to buildings,
19 facilities, and structures. Before entering into a lease or a

A fiscal note for **HOUSE FILE 2464** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2464 relates to the duties of the Director of the Department of General Services. The proposed legislation allows the Director to consider lease-purchase agreements as a method of financing to be used for buying or improving buildings, facilities, or structures. House File 2464 also allows a standing appropriation to be established, funded from the sale of real property. The Director shall submit proposals to the General Assembly concerning the lease-purchase agreement or sale of real property. Before proceeding with the proposal, it must be authorized by a constitutional majority of both Houses and be approved by the Governor.

House File 2464, being enabling legislation, has no fiscal impact. However, there will be a fiscal impact on each proposal.
