RELATING TO CITY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES, BY AUTHORIZING AN INTEREST OF A CITY OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE IN CONTRACTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES BY A CITY AND BY PROVIDING FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF A PORMER CITY COUNCIL MEMBER BY A CITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 362.5, subsection 11, Code 1987, is amended to read as follows:

- 11. Contracts not otherwise permitted by this section, for the purchase of goods or services by a city having a population of <u>nore than two thousand five nundred but</u> less than ten thousand, which benefit a city officer or employee, if the purchases benefiting that officer or employee do not exceed a cumulative total purchase price of one thousand dollars in a fiscal year.
- Sec. 2. Section 362.5, Code 1987, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 12. Contracts not otherwise permitted by this section, for the purchase of goods or services by a city having a population of two thousand five hundred or less, which benefit a city officer or employee, if the purchases benefiting that officer or employee do not exceed a cumulative total purchase price of two thousand five hundred dollars in a fiscal year.
