A BILL FOR

1 An Act authorizing the provision of law enforcement
2 administrative services by agreement between a county and a
3 city and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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SF 2090

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 28E.20 AGREEMENT FOR LAW
2 ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES.

3 A county and a city within the county may enter into an
4 agreement to provide administrative services through the
5 county sheriff to the city for its police department. In
6 addition to other provisions required by this chapter, the
7 agreement shall specify the administrative services to be
8 provided by the sheriff and the administrative or supervisory
9 relationship between the sheriff and the mayor and city
10 council. The agreement is subject to the approval of the
11 county sheriff. The sheriff may accept compensation for the
12 administrative services provided to the city, which
13 compensation is in addition to the sheriff's compensation
14 authorized under section 331.907. The additional compensation
15 shall not be included in computing the total annual
16 compensation of the sheriff pursuant to section 331.904,
17 subsection 2.

18 Sec. 2. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
19 takes effect upon enactment.

20 EXPLANATION

21 This bill authorizes a county and a city within the county
22 to enter into a chapter 28E agreement for the county sheriff
23 to provide administrative services to the city for its police
24 department. The agreement is also subject to the sheriff's
25 approval. The sheriff may accept compensation for the
26 administrative services, which compensation is in addition to
27 the compensation provided under section 331.907.

28 The bill is effective upon enactment.

1 Amend Senate File 2090, as passed by the Senate, as
2 follows:

3 1. Page 1, by inserting after line 17 the
4 following:

5 "A county and a city within the county may enter
6 into an agreement to provide administrative services
7 through the office of chief of police to the county
8 for its office of county sheriff. The agreement is
9 subject to a petition and a referendum of the county
10 electorate favoring abolition of the office of county
11 sheriff. The requirements and procedures for the
12 petition and the election shall be substantially the
13 same as provided in section 331.323, subsection 1. In
14 addition to other provisions required by the chapter,
15 the agreement shall specify the administrative
16 services to be provided by the chief of police and the
17 administrative or supervisory relationship between the
18 chief of police and the board of supervisors. The
19 chief of police shall be responsible for carrying out
20 all of the duties of the office of sheriff. Any
21 additional compensation to the office of chief of
22 police shall be determined by the agreement in lieu of
23 the provisions of section 331.907. The office of
24 county sheriff may be restored by the same petition
25 and election requirements and procedures as provided
26 in this paragraph for abolition of the office."

FISCAL NOTE

REQUESTED BY REPRESENTATIVE RUNNING

In compliance with a written request received February 3, 1988, a fiscal note for HOUSE FILE 2090 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2090 appropriates \$10,000 to the Department of General Services to be used to purchase and distribute POW and MIA flags to the custodians of all public buildings in the State. It also encourages the custodians of public buildings to fly the POW and MIA flags below the American flag and the state emblem and to raise the POW and MIA flag when the American flag and state emblem are raised.

Assumptions:

1. The cost to purchase a MIA and POW flag is \$40.00 per flag.
2. \$10,000 would provide 250 POW and MIA flags for distribution.
3. 11 flags would be displayed on the Capitol Complex, leaving 239 flags to be distributed for display to outlying State offices, State institutions, and Board of Regents institutions.
4. The total number of public buildings in Iowa such as: county courthouses, county office buildings, municipal buildings, fire stations, police stations, and public schools is unknown.

Fiscal Impact:

Based upon the above assumptions, \$10,000 would purchase 250 POW and MIA flags for display. The number of flags which could be purchased would only allow for the distribution of POW and MIA flags for some state buildings, and would not allow for the distribution of POW and MIA flags to all public buildings in the State.

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE PROVISION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES BY AGREEMENT BETWEEN A COUNTY AND A CITY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. NEW SECTION. 28E.20 AGREEMENT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES.

A county and a city within the county may enter into an agreement to provide administrative services through the county sheriff to the city for its police department. In addition to other provisions required by this chapter, the agreement shall specify the administrative services to be provided by the sheriff and the administrative or supervisory relationship between the sheriff and the mayor and city council. The agreement is subject to the approval of the county sheriff. The sheriff may accept compensation for the administrative services provided to the city, which compensation is in addition to the sheriff's compensation authorized under section 331.907. The additional compensation shall not be included in computing the total annual compensation of the sheriff pursuant to section 331.904, subsection 2.
