

3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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- 1 Section 1. Section 601K.52, Code 1987, is amended by
- 2 striking the section and inserting in lieu thereof the
- 3 following:
- 4 601K.52 COMMISSION CREATED.
- 5 The commission on the status of women is created, composed
- 6 of thirteen members as follows:
- Four members of the general assembly serving as ex
- 8 officio nonvoting members, one to be appointed by the speaker
- 9 of the house from the membership of the house, one to be
- 10 appointed by the minority leader of the house from the
- 11 membership of the house, one to be appointed by the majority
- 12 leader of the senate from the membership of the senate, and
- 13 one to be appointed by the minority leader of the senate from
- 14 the membership of the senate.
- 15 2. Nine members to be appointed by the governor
- 16 representing a cross section of the citizens of the state,
- 17 subject to confirmation by the senate.

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN AND OTHER BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, COMMITTEES, AND COUNCILS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 69.16A, Code Supplement 1987, is amended to read as follows:

69.16A GENDER BALANCE.

All appointive boards, commissions, committees and councils of the state established by the Code if not otherwise provided by law shall be gender balanced. No person shall be appointed or reappointed to any hoard, commission, committee, or council established by the Code if that appointment or reappointment would cause the number of members of the board, commission, committee, or council of one gender to be greater than onehalf the membership of the board, commission, committee, or council plus one if the board, commission, committee, or council is composed of an odd number of members. If the board, commission, committee, or council is composed of an even number of members, not more than one-half of the membership shall be of one gender. If there are multiple appointing authorities for a board, commission, committee, or council, they shall consult each other to avoid a violation of this section. This section shall not prohibit an individual from completing a term being served on June 30, 1987.

Sec. 2. Section 601K.52, Code 1987, is amended by striking the section and inserting in lieu thereof the following: 601K.52 COMMISSION CREATED.

The commission on the status of women is created, composed of thirteen members as follows:

- 1. Four members of the general assembly serving as exofficio nonvoting members, one to be appointed by the speaker
 of the house from the membership of the house, one to be
 appointed by the minority leader of the house from the
 membership of the house, one to be appointed by the majority
 leader of the senate from the membership of the senate, and
 one to be appointed by the minority leader of the senate from
 the membership of the senate.
- 2. Nine members to be appointed by the governor representing a cross section of the citizens of the state, subject to confirmation by the senate.

No more than a simple majority of the commission shall be of the same political party. The members of the commission shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson of the commission.

Sec. 3. Section 601K.53, Code 1987, is amended to read as follows:

601K.53 TERM OF OFFICE.

One-half Pour of the members appointed to the initial commission shall be designated by the governor to serve two-year terms, and one-half five shall be designated by the governor to serve four-year terms. The legislative members of the commission shall be appointed to four-year terms of office, two of which shall expire every two years unless somer terminated by a commission member ceasing to be a member of the general assembly. Succeeding appointments shall be for a term of four years. Vacancies in the membership shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

Sec. 4. Section 601K.54, Code 1987, is amended to read as follows:

601K.54 MEETINGS OF THE COMMISSION.

The commission shall meet at least four <u>six</u> times each year, and shall hold special meetings on the call of the chairperson. The commission shall adopt rules pursuant to

chapter 17A as it deems necessary for the commission and division. The members of the commission shall receive a per diem of forty dollars and be reimbursed for actual expenses while engaged in their official duties. Members may also be eligible to receive compensation as provided in section 7E.6. Legislative members of the commission shall receive payment pursuant to sections 2.10 and 2.12.

Sec. 5. The terms of members of the commission on the status of women who were appointed prior to the effective date of this Act shall expire on the effective date of this Act.
