A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to requirements for approved teacher education
2 programs.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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SF 2193

1 Section 1. RULES FOR TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAMS. The
2 board of educational examiners shall adopt rules pursuant to
3 chapter 17A to implement the following for approved teacher
4 education programs:

5 1. A requirement that each student admitted to an approved
6 teacher education program after July 1, 1989, must participate
7 in field experiences that include both observation and
8 participation in teaching activities in a variety of school
9 settings. These field experiences shall be of at least two
10 weeks' duration during the student's first year after
11 admission, eight weeks' duration during the second year after
12 admission, and a full-time student teaching experience of a
13 minimum of twelve weeks' duration during the student's final
14 year of admission.

15 2. A requirement that faculty members in professional
16 education maintain an ongoing involvement in activities in
17 elementary, middle, or secondary schools. The activities
18 shall include at least forty hours of team teaching during
19 each two-year period at the elementary, middle, or secondary
20 level under the supervision of a certificated teacher.

21 3. A requirement that the program includes instruction in
22 skills and strategies to be used in classroom management of
23 individuals, and of small and large groups, under varying
24 conditions; skills for communicating and working
25 constructively with pupils, teachers, administrators, and
26 parents; and skills for understanding the role of the board of
27 education and the functions of other education agencies in the
28 state.

29 4. A requirement that prescribes minimum experiences and
30 responsibilities to be accomplished during the student
31 teaching experience by the student teacher and by the
32 cooperating teacher. The student teaching experience shall
33 consist of interactive experiences involving the college or
34 university personnel, the student teacher, the cooperating
35 teacher, and administrative personnel from the cooperating

1 teacher's school district.

2 5. A requirement that each approved teacher education
3 institution annually offer a workshop of at least one day in
4 duration for prospective cooperating teachers. The workshop
5 shall define the objectives of the student teaching
6 experience, review the responsibilities of the cooperating
7 teacher, and provide the cooperating teacher other information
8 and assistance the institution deems necessary.

9 6. A requirement that teacher education students receive
10 instruction in the use of electronic technology for classroom
11 and instructional purposes.

12 7. A requirement that approved teacher education
13 institutions annually solicit the views of the education
14 community regarding the institution's teacher education
15 programs.

16 8. A requirement that an approved teacher education
17 institution submit evidence that the college or department of
18 education is communicating with other colleges or departments
19 in the institution so that teacher education students may
20 integrate teaching methodology with subject matter areas of
21 specialization.

22 Sec. 2. STUDENT TEACHER EVALUATION COMMITTEE. The board
23 of educational examiners shall appoint a student teacher
24 evaluation committee to develop evaluation forms to be used by
25 the faculty members supervising student teachers at approved
26 teacher education institutions and by cooperating teachers.
27 The teacher evaluation committee shall consist of two members
28 of the teacher education faculty at approved teacher education
29 institutions, one certificated teacher who has fewer than four
30 years of teaching experience, and two certificated teachers,
31 one who is employed to teach at the elementary level and one
32 who is employed to teach at the high school level.

33 The committee shall meet as often as deemed necessary and
34 members shall receive actual and necessary expenses incurred
35 in the conduct of their business from funds appropriated to

1 the department.

2 The committee shall develop standard evaluation forms to
3 assess the performance of student teachers and shall present
4 the forms to the board of educational examiners by January 1,
5 1989. The board of educational examiners shall require that
6 commencing July 1, 1989, approved teacher education institu-
7 tions and cooperating teachers use the forms for evaluating
8 student teachers and place copies of the completed forms in
9 the permanent records of the student teachers.

10 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 262.75 PROGRAMS FOR TEACHER EDUCA-
11 TION.

12 A cooperating teacher incentive program is established to
13 encourage experienced teachers to serve as cooperating
14 teachers for student teachers enrolled in the institutions of
15 higher education under the control of the board. An
16 individual who submits evidence to an institution that the
17 individual has satisfactorily served as a cooperating teacher
18 for a student teacher from any of the institutions of higher
19 education under the control of the board for the duration of
20 the student teaching experience may enroll without tuition
21 charge in a one-semester graduate level course of not
22 exceeding three graduate credits.

23 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 262.76 FACULTY EXCHANGE PROGRAM.

24 A faculty exchange program is established between insti-
25 tutions of higher education under the control of the board and
26 boards of directors of school districts. Each institution
27 shall establish two adjunct faculty positions for certificated
28 teachers employed in school districts in this state. The
29 duration of employment as an adjunct faculty member at an
30 institution under this section shall not exceed two years.
31 The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A defining
32 the scope of duties of an adjunct faculty member employed
33 under this section. Prior to the adoption of rules under this
34 section, the board shall consult with the institutions of
35 higher education under its control and with appropriate

1 personnel from the department of education.

2 EXPLANATION

3 This bill directs the state board of education to adopt
4 rules relating to approved teacher education programs in the
5 following areas:

6 1. Mandating field experiences each year.

7 2. Involvement of teacher education faculty in kinder-
8 garten through grade twelve classroom experiences.

9 3. Specific skill requirements for teacher education
10 students.

11 4. Student teaching responsibilities.

12 5. Assistance to cooperating teachers.

13 6. Instruction in the use of electronic technology.

14 7. Student teaching communication.

15 8. Improving cooperation between education colleges and
16 departments and other colleges and departments at the
17 institution.

18 9. Standard forms for evaluating student teachers.

19 The bill also establishes a cooperating teacher incentive
20 program and a faculty exchange program at state board of
21 regents' universities.

In compliance with a written request received March 30, 1988, a fiscal note for **SENATE FILE 2193 AS PASSED BY THE SENATE** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Section 3 of Senate File 2193 as passed by the Senate establishes a cooperating teacher program which provides incentives to teachers to serve as cooperating teachers for student teachers enrolled in a Board of Regent's institution. The incentive is a tuition waiver at the Board of Regent's institution for a graduate level course of no more than three semester hours.

Assumptions:

1. All cooperating teachers would elect to take a graduate course for the tuition waiver.
2. Currently there are 500, 568, and 800 cooperating K-12 teachers, respectively, working with student teachers enrolled in the University of Northern Iowa, the University of Iowa, and Iowa State University.
3. The average tuition of a three semester hour course at the above respective institutions is \$309, \$335, and \$315.

Fiscal Effect:

The net impact to the Board of Regents institutions in terms of the tuition waiver would be \$600,000 across all three institutions.

The three institutions currently reimburse cooperating teachers at a sliding scale rate of between \$30 and \$120, for a total of approximately \$146,000 across the three institutions. None of the three institutions currently offer a tuition waiver.
