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# HOUSE FILE 2114 FISCAL NOTE



A fiscal note for HOUSE FILE 2114 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2114 changes certain provisions of House File 88, which was passed by the 1989 Session. H.F. 2114 removes the annual non-resident deer and turkey license sales cap of 1,000 and 500 licenses respectively. The bill also removes language that limits hunters who are non-residents to only those zones of the state that have a deer or turkey population of greater than 110% of the biological balance. The bill also repeals the requirement that the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) use income from the sale of non-resident deer and turkey license sales to employ additional Conservation Officers.

In an opinion issued last summer, the Attorney General stated that H.F. 88 allowed deer and turkey hunting by non-residents during calendar year 1989, but the "110% of biological balance" provision would preclude the issuance of licenses in calendar year 1990.

# Assumptions

- 1. 500 spring turkey licenses will be sold (\$50 each).
- 2. 200 fall turkey licenses will be sold (\$50 each).
- 3. 1200 fall deer licenses will be sold (\$100 each).
- 4. Law change is effective by February 1, 1990.
- 5. As provided in current law, each license issued also requires a \$5 Habitat Stamp.

## Fiscal Effect

For FY 1990, the sale of 500 non-resident turkey licenses will generate \$25,000 general license revenue for the Fish and Game Protection Fund and \$2,500 for the Habitat Stamp portion of the same fund. General license revenue can be used for any purpose related to the fish and wildlife activities of the DNR, while Habitat Stamp funds must be used for habitat purchase.

For FY 1991 and after, 200 fall and 500 spring turkey and 1,200 deer license sales will generate \$155,000 in general license revenue and \$9,500 in Habitat Stamp revenue.

If the bill is passed and becomes effective after February 1, 1990, there will be no spring turkey season in FY 1990, and therefore, no fiscal impact in that year.
