A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to reporting requirements for certain cities $\sqrt{-5} \approx 732$ receiving road use tax funds.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 312.12, Code 1989, is amended to read Section 1. 2 as follows: 312.12 PROGRAM SUBMITTED. Cities which receive funds from road use tax funds and 5 which have a population of at least five thousand shall 5-50436 prepare, adopt, and submit to the department on or before 7 December May 1 of each fiscal year a comprehensive program of 8 street construction and reconstruction. Such program shall be 9 prepared for a period of five fiscal years subsequent to the 10 fiscal year in which the program is submitted, based upon the 11 construction funds estimated to be available for each fiscal 12 year. EXPLANATION

This bill eliminates the annual statement detailing the progress made toward completion of projects contained in a city-approved five-year plan which is required of cities with a population of at least 5,000 receiving road use tax funds. The bill also eliminates the annual street construction and reconstruction report required of cities with populations of less than 5,000 and greater than 1,000 receiving road use tax funds.

The bill may include a state mandate as defined in section 2 25B.3. BACKGROUND STATEMENT 3 SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY The state of Iowa is required to report data to the federal 6 highway administration (FHWA) to qualify for federal highway 7 funds for city, county, and state streets and highways. 8 ports submitted to the department of transportation by local 9 governments are used to prepare state reports to FHWA. After 10 reviewing the reporting requirements, the department finds 11 some reports are no longer essential to meet the federal 12 reporting requirements. The department of transportation recommends two reports 14 submitted by cities be eliminated. These reports are: The annual statement by cities with 5,000 and greater popu-16 lation showing the progress made toward the completion of each 17 project contained in their approved five-year program. 18 The report that cities with less than 5,000 population and 19 greater than 1,000 population prepare and submit annually by 20 December 31 detailing their program of proposed street 21 construction and reconstruction for the ensuing fiscal year. The usefulness of these reports submitted to the department 22 23 of transportation by cities is extremely limited. Therefore, 24 the amount of time and effort expended by cities to file the 25 reports is not warranted and the requirement should be deleted 26 from the Code. 27 The department also recommends the date for cities of at 28 least 5,000 population to submit a comprehensive five-year 29 plan to the department be changed to May 1 from December 1 of 30 each fiscal year to accommodate the cities' planning process. The league of Iowa municipalities supports this proposal. 31 32 33 34 35

RELATING TO REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN CITIES RECEIV-ING ROAD USE TAX FUNDS, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 312.12, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows:

312.12 PROGRAM SUBMITTED.

Cities which receive funds from road use tax funds and which have a population of at least five thousand shall prepare, adopt, and submit deliver to the department on or before Becember May 1 of each fiscal year a comprehensive program of street construction and reconstruction. Such program shall be prepared for a period of five fiscal years subsequent to the fiscal year in which the program is submitted, based upon the construction funds estimated to be available for each fiscal year. At-the-close-of-each-fiscal year, as-a-part-of-the-five-year-plan, the-city-shall-include a-statement-of-the-progress-made-toward-the-completion-of-each project-contained-in-the-approved-program.—Such-cities-which have-a-population-of-less-than-five-thousand-and-greater-than

one-thousand-shall-prepare-and-submit-annually-by-December-31 of-each-year-to-the-department-for-examination-and-review,-a program-of-proposed-street-construction-and-reconstruction-for its-total-system-of-streets-for-the-ensuing-fiscal-year. Nothing-in-this This section shall does not prohibit a city of less than five thousand from adopting by resolution a comprehensive five-year plan.

Sec. 2. Section 312.14, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows:

312.14 CITIES TO SUBMIT REPORT.

Cities in the state which receive allotments of funds from road use tax funds shall prepare and submit-by deliver on or before September 10 30 each year to the department an annual report showing all street receipts and expenditures for the city for the previous fiscal year.

Sec. 3. Section 312.15, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows:

312.15 WHEN FUNDS NOT ALLOCATED.

Funds shall not be allocated to any city until such city shall have complied with the provisions of sections 312.11, 312.12 and 312.14.

If a city has not complied with the provisions of section 312.14, the treasurer of state shall withhold funds allocated to the city until the city complies. If a city has not complied with the provisions of section 312.14 by December 31 following the date the report was required, funds shall not be allocated to the city until the city has complied and all funds withheld under this paragraph shall revert to the street construction fund of the cities.

The department shall notify the treasurer of state if any city fails to comply with the provisions of sections 312.11, 312.12 and 312.14.

Sec. 4. Any funds not allocated to cities under the provisions of section 312.15 during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990 shall be restored to the cities affected from the street construction fund of the cities.

Sec. 5. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
