Section 317.1, subsection 2, unnumbered 1 2 paragraph 1, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows: 3 Secondary noxious weeds, which shall include butterprint 4 (Abutilon theophrasti) annual, cocklebur (Xanthium commune) 5 annual, wild mustard (Brassica arvensis) annual, wild carrot 6 (Daucus carota) biennial, buckhorn (Plantago lanceolata) 7 perennial, sheep sorrel (Rumex acetosella) perennial, sour 8 dock (Rumex crispus) perennial, smooth dock (Rumex altissimus) 9 perennial, poison hemlock (Conium maculatum), multiflora rose 10 (Rosa multiflora), wild sunflower (wild strain of Helianthus 11 annus L.) annual, puncture vine (Tribulus terrestris) annual, 12 teasel (Dipsacus) biennial, and shattercane (Sorghum bicolor) 13 annual, and marijuana (Cannibus sativa) annual. 14 EXPLANATION The bill adds marijuana to the list of secondary noxious 15 16 weeds, thus permitting county weed commissioners and county 17 boards of supervisors to destroy marijuana. 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35

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

RELATING TO THE IDENTIFICATION AND ERADICATION OF MARIJUANA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 80.9, subsection 2, Code 1989, is amended by adding the following new paragraph:

NEW PARAGRAPH. g. To identify and eradicate marijuana plants found growing on public or private property when growing marijuana plants are reported to the department, and adopt rules governing the identification and eradication of marijuana plants in cooperation with local law enforcement officials.

Sec. 2. Section 317.4, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows:

317.4 DIRECTION AND CONTROL.

As used in this chapter, "commissioner" means the county weed commissioner or the commissioner's deputy within each county. Each commissioner, subject to direction and control by the county board of supervisors, shall supervise the control and destruction of all noxious weeds in the county, including those growing within the limits of cities, within the confines of abandoned cemeteries, and along streets and highways unless otherwise provided. <u>A commissioner shall</u> notify the department of public safety of the location of marijuana plants found growing on public or private property. A commissioner may enter upon any land in the county at any time for the performance of the commissioner's duties, and shall hire the laoor and equipment necessary subject to the approval of the board of supervisors.

Sec. 3. Section 317.22, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows:

317.22 DUTY OF HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE PERSONNEL.

It-shall-be-the-duty-of-all <u>All</u> officers directly responsible for the care of public highways to <u>shall</u> make <u>a</u> complaint to the weed commissioners or board of supervisors, whenever <u>if</u> it <u>shall-appear</u> <u>appears</u> that the provisions of this chapter may not be complied with in time to prevent the blooming and maturity of noxious weeds or the unlawful growth of weeds <u>or marijuana</u>, whether in the streets or highways for which they are responsible or upon lands adjacent to the same.
