# BACKGROUND STATEMENT SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY

3 The proposed changes to section 601K.94 will bring the Code 4 of Iowa in line with the language of the federal regulations 5 regarding the composition of community action agency boards of 6 directors. While the changes are minimal, the proposed 7 language will give the community action agencies additional 8 options in selection of public officials.

9 The proposed language will also allow for community action 10 agencies to establish procedures to assure that the low-income 11 of the area are represented on the policymaking board. 12 The proposed language clarifies the reporting requirements 13 of the division of community action agencies, department of 14 human rights, eliminating a duplication of reporting 15 requirements.
