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HOUSE FILE 2271 FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for House File 2271 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2271 is a bill which makes modifications to Phase III of the Education Excellence Program.

Section 1 adds language which specifies what is to be included in a performance-based pay plan, for the purposes of granting allowable growth for the following year. It allows for up to 5% of the funds to be used for the salaries of unlicensed support staff who are directly involved in the implementation of the plan. It also provides a definition of a performance-based pay plan.

Section 2 changes the date that area education agencies and local school districts must submit their plan, from July 1 to March 15.

Assumptions Used:

The enrollment will remain constant at 482,208 for the local education agencies (LEA) and 529,026 for the area education agencies (AEA).

The payment per student will remain constant at \$82.66 for LEA students, and \$3.85 for the AEA students.

Under current law, 75% of the plans will be eligible for allowable growth for FY 1992, and 80% will be eligible for FY 1993. Under proposed law, all of the plans (100%) will be eligible for allowable growth for both FY 1992 and FY 1993.

All districts would use 5% of the funds for unlicensed staff.

Fiscal Estimate:

This bill would have no fiscal effect in FY 1991.

A fiscal note for Amendment H-5128 to House File 2271 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Amendment H-51228 amends House File 2271 as follows:

Section one adds intent language stating that the fundamental changes in the educational system must come from the school site, and that plans submitted under the Phase III Program must be a part of a district's effort to meets its identified goals.

Section two deletes language allowing a combination of a performance-based pay plan or supplemental pay plan to be submitted under Phase III, and substitutes the term "comprehensive school transformation program."

Sections three, four and five delete language which include the participation in innovative education program, or comprehensive school transformation plan as what Phase III plans should include.

Section six adds language which defines a comprehensive school transformation plan.

Fiscal Effect:

The amendment has no FY 1991 fiscal effect.

This amendment deletes language in House File 2271 which would have resulted in additional Phase III plans being approved, and therefore eligible for an inflationary increase in FY 1992. Therefore this amendment eliminates the original fiscal effect of House File 2271 of \$523,000 in FY 1992, and \$982,000 in FY 1993.

For school districts, the plan may include assessments of specific teaching behavior, assessments of student performance, assessments of other characteristics associated with effective teaching, or a combination of these criteria.

Sec. 3. Section 294A.14, Code Supplement 1989, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:

NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. For purposes of this section, a comprehensive school transformation plan shall include, but is not limited to, providing salary increases to teachers who implement site-based decision making, building-based goal-oriented compensation mechanisms, or approved innovative educational programs, who focus on student outcomes, who direct accountability for student achievement, accountability for organizational success, and who work to expand community or business relationships.

Sec. 4. Section 294A.16, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code Supplement 1989, is amended to read as follows:

A plan adopted by the board of directors of a school district or area education agency shall be submitted to the department of education not later than July-1 March 15 of a school year for that school year for a school district, and not-later-than-September-1-of-a-school-year-for-that-school

year for an area education agency. Amendments to multiple year plans may be submitted annually.
