2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 135B.1, subsection 1, Code 1989, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 1. "Hospital" means a place which is devoted primarily to
- 4 the maintenance and operation of facilities for the diagnosis,
- 5 treatment or care over a period exceeding twenty-four hours of
- 6 two or more nonrelated individuals suffering from illness,
- 7 injury, or deformity, or a place which is devoted primarily to
- 8 the rendering over a period exceeding twenty-four hours of
- 9 obstetrical or other medical or nursing care for two or more
- 10 nonrelated individuals, or any institution, place, building or
- 11 agency in which any accommodation is primarily maintained,
- 12 furnished or offered for the care over a period exceeding
- 13 twenty-four hours of two or more nonrelated aged or infirm
- 14 persons requiring or receiving chronic or convalescent care;
- 15 and shall include sanatoriums or other related institutions

A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to licensure of freestanding hospice facilities. 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 135.90, Code 1989, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 10. "Freestanding hospice facility" means
- 4 a facility, not licensed under chapter 135B or 135C, which
- 5 maintains a hospice program and provides accommodations,
- 6 board, and nursing services to three or more hospice patients
- 7 for periods exceeding twenty-four consecutive hours.
- 8 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 135.97 FREESTANDING HOSPICE
- 9 FACILITY.
- 10 1. Notwithstanding section 135.91, a person or govern-
- 11 mental unit, acting severally or jointly with any other
- 12 person, shall not establish or operate a freestanding hospice
- 13 facility in this state without a license issued pursuant to
- 14 this division.
- 15 2. To be licensed a freestanding hospice facility must
- 16 meet all the requirements of sections 135.90 through 135.97
- 17 and all current standards for federal medicare certification.
- 18 3. The department shall recognize in lieu of its own li-
- 19 censure inspection the comparable federal medicare inspection
- 20 findings.
- 21 EXPLANATION
- 22 This bill requires a hospice program provider, offering
- 23 services in a freestanding facility which is not a hospital or
- 24 health care facility licensed under chapter 135B or 135C,
- 25 respectively, to obtain a license from the department of
- 26 inspections and appeals. Currently, licensure is voluntary
- 27 for hospice programs regardless of the location of the
- 28 services provided.
- 29 BACKGROUND STATEMENT
- 30 SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY
- 31 This bill allows for the development of freestanding
- 32 hospice facilities, distinct from hospitals, intermediate care
- 33 facilities, skilled nursing facilities, and nursing
- 34 facilities. The department of inspections and appeals
- 35 currently has the authority to develop standards for hospice

1 programs. This bill provides the authority for the department 2 of inspections and appeals to develop and enforce standards 3 for these facilities.

The need for these freestanding hospice facilities has de-5 veloped in Iowa communities. This legislative change has been 6 requested by some hospice organizations. The department of 7 inspections and appeals wants to ensure that these facilities 8 meet standards to protect the health, safety, and welfare of 9 the residents.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 135B.1, subsection 1, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows:

1. "Hospital" means a place which is devoted primarily to the maintenance and operation of facilities for the diagnosis, treatment or care over a period exceeding twenty-four hours of two or more nonrelated individuals suffering from illness, injury, or deformity, or a place which is devoted primarily to the rendering over a period exceeding twenty-four hours of obstetrical or other medical or nursing care for two or more nonrelated individuals, or any institution, place, building or agency in which any accommodation is primarily maintained, furnished or offered for the care over a period exceeding twenty-four hours of two or more nonrelated aged or infirm persons requiring or receiving chronic or convalescent care; and shall include sanatoriums or other related institutions within the meaning of this chapter. Provided, however, nothing in this chapter shall apply to hotels or other similar places that furnish only food and lodging, or either, to their guests or to a freestanding hospice facility which operates a hospice program in accordance with 42 C.F.R. § 418. "Hospital" shall include, in any event, any facilities wholly or partially constructed or to be constructed with federal financial assistance, pursuant to Public Law 725, 79th Congress, approved August 13, 1946.

Sec. 2. Section 135C.6, Code 1989, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 7. A freestanding hospice facility which operates a hospice program in accordance with 42 C.F.R. § 418

may be operated without obtaining a license under this chapter and shall not be deemed to be licensed by the state.
