30 BACKGROUND STATEMENT

31 SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY

32 These two changes in Iowa Code chapter 204 will bring Iowa
33 language in conformance with the federal Uniform Controlled
34 Substances Act. The two substances to be added as schedule II
35 substances are currently available as pharmaceutical products

1 in Iowa. As such, they need to be incorporated into chapter
2 204 so that the controls inherent in chapter 204 can be
3 applied to their distribution. The substance "carfentanil" is
4 a synthetic morphine-like product. The substance "nabilone"
5 is a synthetic derivative of chemicals found in marijuana and
6 is used as an antinauseant.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 204.206, subsection 3, Code 1989, is amended by adding the following new paragraph and relettering the subsequent paragraphs:

NEW PARAGRAPH. f. Carfentanil.

Sec. 2. Section 204.206, subsection 7, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows:

7. HALLUCINOGENIC SUBSTANCES. Unless specifically excepted or unless listed in another schedule, any material, compound, mixture, or preparation which contains any quantity of the following substances:

a. ~~Marijuana is deemed to be a schedule II substance~~ when used for medicinal purposes pursuant to rules of the board of pharmacy examiners.

b. Dronabinol (synthetic) in sesame oil and encapsulated in a soft gelatin capsule in a United States food and drug administration approved drug product. [Some other names for dronabinol ~~(6aR-trans)-6a (6aR-trans)-6a, 7, 8, 10a-tetrahydro-6, 6, 9-trimethyl-3-pentyl-6H-dibenzo~~ 9-trimethyl-3-pentyl-6H-dibenzo [b,d] pyran-1-01, or (-)-delta (-)-delta 9-(trans)-tetrahydrocannabinol.]
