1 Section 1. Section 455B.386, Code 1989, is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 455B.386 NOTIFICATION OF SPILLS -- PENALTY.

A person manufacturing, storing, handling, transporting, or 4 5 disposing of a hazardous substance shall notify the 6 department, and the local police department, or the office of 7 the sheriff of the affected county of the occurrence of a 8 hazardous condition as soon as possible but not later than six 9 hours after the onset of the hazardous condition or discovery 10 of the hazardous condition. A sheriff or police chief who has 11 been notified of a hazardous condition shall immediately 12 notify the department. The department, upon receiving notice 13 of a hazardous condition, shall immediately notify the 14 operator of any public water supply system or private water 15 supply system which may be affected by the hazardous 16 condition. If requested, a person shall submit within thirty 17 days of the department's request a written report of 18 particulars of the incident. A person violating this section 19 is subject to a civil penalty of not more than one thousand 20 dollars.

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EXPLANATION

This bill modifies the notification requirements relating to hazardous spills to include an obligation to notify any possibly affected public or private water supply systems of the occurrence of a hazardous condition. Currently, a person responsible for hazardous substances is required to notify reither the department of natural resources, or the local police or sheriff. The bill would instead require the responsible person to notify both the department and local authorities. When the local police or sheriff's office is notified according to this bill, the office must then notify the department of natural resources. The department is then required to notify any public or private water supply system which may be affected.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 455B.386, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows:

455B.386 NOTIFICATION OF SPILLS -- PENALTY.

A person manufacturing, storing, handling, transporting, or disposing of a hazardous substance shall notify the department, and the local police department, or the office of the sheriff of the affected county of the occurrence of a hazardous condition as soon as possible but not later than six hours after the onset of the hazardous condition or discovery of the hazardous condition. A sheriff or police chief who has been notified of a hazardous condition shall immediately notify the department. The department, upon receiving notice of a hazardous condition, shall immediately notify the operator of any public water supply system or private water supply system which may be affected by the hazardous condition. If requested, a person shall submit within thirty days of the department's request a written report of particulars of the incident. A person violating this section DONALD D.
