A fiscal note for House File 2468 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2468 renames the Division of Criminal and Juvenile Justice Planning to the Division of Criminal Justice Planning. The duties of the Division are expanded. The Division is directed to establish and maintain an Iowa correctional policy project for the purpose of conducting analyses of major correctional issues affecting the criminal and juvenile justice system. The Council is increased from 13 to 21 members.

Assumptions

- 1. Expanding the duties for the Division will result in increasing the need for additional resources.
- 2. Increasing the number of Council members will increase travel and expense costs of Council meetings.
- 3. One-time costs will be incurred for computer and office equipment.

Fiscal Impact

he Criminal and Juvenile Justice Planning Division estimates that the fiscal impact of House File 2468 is \$205,300 and five FTE positions during FY 1991 and \$190,400 during FY 1992. The costs decrease in FY 1992 due to one-time purchases of equipment during FY 1991. Fewer resources would decrease the scope of the correctional policy project.
