ll partisan elective office. The bill provides that the civil

12 service officers and employees, and deputy sheriffs, may use

13 any accumulated paid leave time during the period in which the

14 person is required to be on leave during the election process.

15 The bill also provides that a leave of absence is required

16 during the thirty-day period prior to both the primary

17 election and the general election until the person is

18 eliminated as a candidate or wins the election.

19 This bill may establish a state mandate under chapter 25B.
