      This bill provides that interest earned on moneys in a
23 prison institution's canteen fund is considered part of the
24 fund. The bill allows the director to use the fund for the
25 direct and collective benefit of the inmates of the
26 institution.
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HOUSE FILE 432 FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for HOUSE FILE 432 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 432 concerns the Department of Corrections' canteen funds at the Institutions. The canteen fund is a self-sustaining revolving fund designed to provide inmates the opportunity to purchase personal items and necessities. Currently, the interest generated from the canteen fund is deposited in the General Fund.

House File 432 allows the interest earned from the canteen fund to remain in the canteen fund. It also clarifies how profits may be used, i.e., for the benefit of the general population rather than the individual inmate.

Assumptions

- 1. The current balance in the canteen fund will remain static.
- The interest rate is 8%.

Fiscal Effect

House File 432 would reduce General Fund revenue by approximately \$2,280 per year.

- 27 BACKGROUND STATEMENT
- 28 SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY
- 29 The purpose of this bill is to clarify what moneys make up
- 30 the canteen fund and how the profits may be used. The canteen
- 31 fund is a self-sustaining revolving fund designed to provide
- 32 inmates the opportunity to purchase personal items and
- 33 necessities. The canteens are operated without cost to the
- 34 institutions with moneys generated by inmate purchases. The
- 35 department believes that the interest generated by the money

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l in the canteen fund should also be retained in the fund and
 2 used to benefit the inmates as are the profits from sales.
      This bill is also intended to clarify how profits in the
 4 canteen fund are used. It has been the practice to use such
 5 profits to purchase items that will benefit the inmate
 6 population as a whole such as recreational equipment and
 7 library materials. Recently this practice has been questioned
 8 and the suggestion made that each inmate should individually
 9 benefit from their contribution to the fund. This approach to
10 disbursal of the fund profits would create bookkeeping
11 nightmares as well as diluting the benefits received by
12 inmates.
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      The department believes that the proposed language will
14 clarify these issues and direct the use of the canteen fund in
15 manner that will benefit all inmates.
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AN ACT

RELATING TO CANTEEN FUNDS UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 246.310, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows:

246.310 CANTEENS.

The director may maintain a canteen at any institution under the director's jurisdiction for the sale to persons confined in the institution of items such as toilet articles, candy, tobacco products, notions, and other sundries, and may provide the necessary facilities, equipment, personnel, and merchandise for the canteen. The director shall specify the items to be sold in the canteen. The department may establish and maintain a permanent operating fund for each canteen. The fund shall consist of the receipts from the sale of commodities at the canteen and any interest earned on the fund. Any money in the fund over the amount needed to do normal business transactions, and to reimburse any accounts which have subsidized the canteen fund, shall be considered profit. This money may remain in the canteen fund and be used

for any purchase which the superintendent approves that will directly and collectively benefit the inmates during-their incarceration of the institution.
