A fiscal note for HOUSE FILE 522 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 522 permits a committee of county officers (treasurer, auditor, and recorder or county attorney) to call a special election to fill a vacancy on the county board of supervisors in lieu of appointment.

Fiscal Impact:

Since election costs are borne by the counties, there will be no cost to the General Fund. Given that a committee of county officers may choose between having a special election or appointing a county supervisor, no estimate of how many special elections will be held can be made at this time. If a special election were held, the costs would be expected to range between \$4,500 for a small county (with no primary) up to \$50,000 in a large county with a full county-wide election. These costs would vary greatly depending on a variety of factors.
