1 Section 1. HOURS OF INSTRUCTION. The state board of
2 education shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A which
3 consider time spent on parent-teacher conferences as
4 instructional time for the purpose of meeting the required
5 minimum number of instructional hours per day.

6 The state board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A
7 which permit a school to provide up to five fewer days of
8 instruction during a school year for high school seniors who
9 have completed the requirements for graduation in the
10 district.

11 EXPLANATION

12 This bill requires the state board of education to adopt
13 rules to include time spent on parent-teacher conferences as
14 instructional time in a minimum school day. The bill also
15 permits a school to provide five fewer days of instruction to
16 graduating high school seniors.

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NUMBER OF DAYS AND HOURS OF INSTRUCTION IN SCHOOL PER SCHOOL DAY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. HOURS OF INSTRUCTION. The state board of education shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A which consider time spent on parent-teacher conferences as instructional time for the purpose of meeting the required minimum number of instructional hours per day.

The state board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A which permit a school to provide up to five fewer days of instruction during a school year for high school seniors who
