11 This bill increases the amount of the fee retained by
12 county treasurers for use tax collection on vehicles from
13 twenty-five cents to one dollar for each tax payment

**SENATE FILE 132
FISCAL NOTE**

A fiscal note for **SENATE FILE 132** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 132 has a fiscal impact by increasing the amount of the fee retained by the county treasurer for use tax collection on vehicles from twenty-five cents to one dollar for each tax payment collected.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Counties currently collect use tax on about 700,000 titles a year. Under the current system, counties retain twenty-five cents per payment collected or \$175,000 a year. Under the proposed bill, counties will retain one dollar per tax payment collected, or about \$700,000 a year.

The bill will reduce the amount of receipts to the Road Use Tax Fund by approximately \$525,000. That amount will instead be credited to the counties general fund.

RELATING TO THE FEE RETAINED BY COUNTY TREASURERS FOR USE
TAX COLLECTION ON VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 423.6, subsection 1, Code 1989, is amended to read as follows:

1. The tax upon the use of all vehicles subject to registration or subject only to the issuance of a certificate of title shall be collected by the county treasurer or the state department of transportation pursuant to section 423.7. The county treasurer shall retain ~~twenty-five-cents~~ one dollar.
