**SENATE FILE 2082
FISCAL NOTE**

A fiscal note for SF 2082 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 2082 proposes to indefinitely extend the effect of Chapter 225C, Code of Iowa 1989, which relates to persons with mental illness, mental retardation, and developmental disabilities by repealing a sunset clause effective on July 1, 1990. A brief description of the Chapter and the effects of this bill's passage follows.

- A. Chapter 225C, Code of Iowa 1989, establishes a number of entities including the Department of Human Services' Division of Mental Health, Mental Retardation, and Developmentally Disabled (MH/MR/DD); the MH/MR Commission; the MH/MR/DD Advisory Committee; the State Community MH/MR Services Fund; and the Family Support Subsidy Program. This Chapter also delineates duties of these entities, how certain monies may be spent by counties, and the Division Administrator's responsibilities. The passage of this bill would maintain the statutory requirements and authorization of these entities.
- B. This Chapter also contains the Bill of Rights for persons with mental retardation, developmental disabilities, or chronic mental illness (MR/DD/CMI). The Bill of Rights describes 10 rights applicable to the MR/DD/CMI population. With the passage of Senate File 2082, any costs attributable to the Bill of Rights continue to exist.

Fiscal Effect:

Since the fiscal impact of the Bill of Rights language is unknown, the fiscal effect of Senate File 2082 cannot be determined.
