A fiscal note for **SENATE PILE 365** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 365 provides that campaign disclosure reports for city and school elective offices will have the same filing deadlines as other campaign committees. Also, committees for local ballot issues have the same filing requirements as statewide ballot issue committees.

FISCAL EFFECT: Under current law, city and school elected officers and local ballot issue committees have monthly filing deadlines rather than quarterly. This would result in savings of postage costs for all filers. Specifically, county auditors would save between \$25 and \$50 annually.
