FISCAL NOTE**

A fiscal note for **SENATE FILE 391** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 391 requires a county sheriff to file a monthly report with the Department of Corrections. The report shall include information regarding the average daily population of the jail, and the number of men, women, and juveniles held. The Department of Corrections shall provide a uniform reporting form to the county sheriff.

Assumption

1. Currently, approximately 50% of the counties report this type of information to the Department of Corrections.

Fiscal Impact

There is no fiscal impact upon the General Fund. There may be a nominal increase in administrative expenses for counties which currently do not report to the Department of Corrections. However, that cost cannot be estimated.
