A BILL FOR 1 An Act authorizing the director of public health or the director's agent to conduct epidemiological blinded studies. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- Section 1. Section 135.11, Code 1989, is amended by adding the following new subsection:
- 3 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 24. Notwithstanding any other provisions
- 4 of law to the contrary, conduct, through the department or
- 5 through an agent of the director, a state or federally funded
- 6 epidemiological blinded study, in which the director is not
- 7 required to obtain informed consent, not required to solicit
- 8 information that personally identifies persons selected to
- 9 participate in the study, and not required to reveal the
- 10 identity of the participants, if the director determines that
- 11 both of the following conditions apply:
- 12 a. The study monitors the incidence or prevalence of a
- 13 serious disease to detect potential health problems and

All personal identifiers shall be permanently stripped from the specimens selected prior to testing for the human immunodeficiency virus infection.

For the purposes of this section, "epidemiological blinded study" means a study in which blood specimens which were collected for other purposes are selected according to established criteria, are permanently stripped of personal identifiers, and are then tested.
