1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 455C.15 PLASTIC CANS PROHIBITED.

2 1. A person shall not manufacture, offer for sale, or sell
3 any single-serving beverage container which is a plastic can
4 nor offer for sale or sell any beverage packaged in a single-
5 serving plastic can. For the purposes of this section, a
6 "plastic can" means a beverage container which, in addition to
7 the closure mechanism, is composed of plastic and metal.

8 2. A person violating this section is guilty of a serious
9 misdemeanor.

10 EXPLANATION

11 This bill prohibits the manufacture or sale of a beverage
12 container which is a plastic can and the sale of a beverage
13 packaged in a plastic can. Plastic can is defined as a
14 beverage container composed of both plastic and metal. The
15 bill also provides the penalty of a serious misdemeanor for
16 violation of the prohibition.

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PROHIBITION OF PLASTIC BEVERAGE CANS, AND
PROVIDING A PENALTY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. NEW SECTION. 455C.15 PLASTIC CANS PROHIBITED.

1. A person shall not manufacture, offer for sale, or sell any single-serving beverage container which is a plastic can nor offer for sale or sell any beverage packaged in a single-serving plastic can. For the purposes of this section, a "plastic can" means a beverage container which, in addition to the closure mechanism, is composed of plastic and metal.
