17 This bill removes the requirement for departmental approval
18 of rules adopted by the board of cosmetology examiners and the
19 board of barber examiners in the department of public health.

20 The bill also repeals a provision relating to departmental
21 approval of colleges in which are taught the professions
22 regulated by the department of public health.

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23 BACKGROUND STATEMENT

24 SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY

25 Two outdated Code provisions are no longer pertinent to
26 ensuring the public health of Iowans.

27 First, the Code requires the Department of Public Health to
28 keep an up-to-date list of accredited colleges that teach
29 professions regulated by Chapter 147. In reality, educational
30 requirements for these professions are defined by Code and by
31 Administrative Rule. The Department has no input into estab-
32 lishment of curriculum or college programs nor does it have
33 the expertise to evaluate these programs. Colleges and
34 universities are subject to other oversight bodies that can
35 more appropriately evaluate them.

1 Second, the Board of Barber Examiners and Board of
2 Cosmetology Examiners are required to have rules they
3 promulgate be approved by the Board of Health. Originating
4 over sanitation concerns, this now requires the Board of
5 Health to approve rules governing the content of continuing
6 education for barbers and cosmetologists. There are other
7 sections of the Code that deal with sanitation. And, other
8 professional boards in Chapter 147 do not require Board of
9 Health approval of rules.

10 This proposal will eliminate these outdated provisions
11 described above.

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Sec. 3. Section 147.32, Code 1989, is repealed.
