FISCAL NOTE**

A fiscal note for **SENATE FILE 96** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 96 extends indefinitely the Health Data Commission (HDC), prohibits the Commission from contracting in certain cases of conflicts of interest, and requires hospitals to submit certain information to the Commission regarding nonsponsored care.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Charity, bad debt, and self-pay cases represent approximately 10% of the total number of cases treated in a hospital.
2. The HDC on an annual basis collects 300,000 inpatient records and 700,000 outpatient records. Physician related cases may be 1.5 times those in the hospital inpatient and outpatient setting.
3. The major cost will be for keypunching. Keypunching costs approximately \$.41 per record.

FISCAL EFFECT:

The annual fiscal effect of Senate File 96 would be \$102,500, based on the following figures:

Senate File 96, as amended by Senate Amendment 3043, would extend the Health Data Commission (HDC) to July 1, 1993 and would exempt hospitals with fewer than 100 licensed acute care beds from installing computerized severity of illness systems and those hospitals with more than 100 licensed acute care beds would be exempt from installing the system until July 1, 1990.

FISCAL EFFECT:

Senate Amendment 3043 would return the HDC to current funding levels.
