A fiscal note for SENATE FILE 96 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 96 extends indefinitely the Health Data Commission (HDC), prohibits the Commission from contracting in certain cases of conflicts of interest, and requires hospitals to submit certain information to the Commission regarding nonsponsored care.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Charity, bad debt, and self-pay cases represent approximately 10% of the total number of cases treated in a hospital.
- 2. The HDC on an annual basis collects 300,000 inpatient records and 700,000 outpatient records. Physician related cases may be 1.5 times those in the hospital inpatient and outpatient setting.
- 3. The major cost will be for keypunching. Keypunching costs approximately \$.41 per record.

FISCAL EFFECT:
