A fiscal note for House File 2415 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2415 prohibits the board of directors of public school districts and the authorities in charge of nonpublic schools from requiring nonadministrative personnel to perform any special or intrusive, nonemergency medical or health services for students, unless they are licensed or have consented to perform the services.

Assumptions:

- * There are currently 81 districts that reported no health services.
- If necessary, these districts would employ a half-time health services staff, with an average salary of \$11,150.
- For districts that have existing health services, this legislation would have no additional impact.
- While this affects the expenditures of a district, it does not affect the school foundation formula, so it does not affect the amount of money a district receives.

Fiscal Estimate:

House File 2415 has no additional general fund or property tax impact. It could however, cost districts approximately \$903,000 (\$11,150 X 81). The impact on districts could also be less, if they opted to not hire the staff listed above.

A fiscal note for **House File 2415** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2415 promibits the board of directors of public school districts and the authorities in charge of nonpublic schools from requiring nonadministrative personnel to perform any special or intrusive, nonemergency medical or health services for students, unless they are licensed or have consented to perform the services.

Assumptions:

- There are currently 81 districts that reported no health services.
- If necessary, these districts would employ a half-time health services staff, with an average salary of \$11,150.
- For districts that have existing health services, this legislation would have no additional impact.
- State expenditures will be approximately 83% of the total expenditures for FY 1993, and property taxes would be approximately 17% of the total.

Fiscal Estimate:

House file 2415 could cost approximately \$903,000 ($$11,150 \times 81$). Of this amount, state expenditures would be \$749,000 ($$903,000 \times .83$), and \$153,000 ($$903,000 \times .17$) would be property taxes.

The actual impact could be less, if districts opted to not hire the staff listed above.

- 21 The bill prohibits deletion of territory from a city if it
- 22 would create an island. Currently, annexation of territory
- 23 which would create an island is prohibited.
- 24 The bill also provides that a committee may not approve
- 25 either the establishment of a new city which is within two
- 26 miles of an existing city, rather than within the urbanized
- 27 area of a city, unless a petition for annexation of
- 28 substantially the same territory was dismissed, disapproved,
- 29 or voted upon unfavorably within the last five years, or a
- 30 city development action which creates an island.
