BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TOWAR

Section 1. Section 601D.11, Code 1991, is amended to read as follows:

6010.11 SERVICE DOGS AND ASSISTIVE ANIMALS.

- 1. For purposes of this section "service dog" means a dog specially trained at a recognized training facility to assist a disabled or handicapped person, whether described as a service dog, a support dog, an independence dog, or otherwise. "Assistive animal" means a similar or other animal specially trained or in the process of being trained under the auspices of a recognized training facility to assist a disabled or handicapped person.
- 2. A disabled or handlcapped person or person training an assistive animal has the right to be accompanied by a service dog or an assistive animal, under control, in any of the places listed in sections 6010.3 and 6010.4 without being required to rake additional payment for the service dog or assistive animal. A landlord shall waive lease restrictions on the keeping of dogs animals for the service dog or assistive animal of a disabled or handloapped person. The cerson is liable for damage done to any premises or facility by a service dog or assistive animal.
- A person who knowingly denies or interferes with the right of a person under this section is, upon conviction, quilty of a simple misdemeanor.
