1 An Act relating to, and increasing the fees for, fishing,
2 hunting, and related licenses, and providing effective dates.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 703

1 Section 1. Section 109.60, Code 1991, is amended to read
2 as follows:

3 109.60 RAISING GAME -- RULEMAKING AUTHORITY.

4 A person shall not raise or sell game or fur-bearing
5 animals of the kinds protected by this chapter, except rock
6 doves and pigeons, without first procuring a game breeder's
7 license as provided by law. The commission may adopt rules
8 which ensure that all game birds, game animals, and fur-
9 bearing animals handled and confined by licensed game breeders
10 are provided with humane care and treatment. A violation of a
11 rule adopted by the commission is a cause for license
12 revocation. This section does not apply to governmental zoos
13 and exhibits.

6 by adding the following new subsection:

7 NEW SUBSECTION. 17. The department shall issue
8 without charge a special annual fishing or combined
9 hunting and fishing license to residents of this state
10 who are permanently disabled and whose income falls
11 below the federal poverty guidelines as published by
12 the United States department of health and human
13 services or residents of this state who are sixty-five
14 years of age or older and whose income falls below the
15 federal poverty guidelines as published by the United
16 States department of health and human services. The
17 commission shall provide for, by rule, an application
18 to be used by an applicant requesting a permanent
19 disabled status or age status. The commission shall
20 require proof of age, income, and proof of permanent
21 disability.

22 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATES.

23 1. The fees specified in column I in section 2 of this Act
24 shall be effective for the 1992 through 1994 license years,
25 except as otherwise provided in subsection 3.

26 2. The fees specified in column II in section 2 of this
27 Act shall be effective for the 1995 license year, and during
28 each subsequent calendar year until otherwise provided by the
29 general assembly.

30 3. This Act takes effect on December 15, 1991, except
31 that:

32 a. This section, the deer hunting license fees specified
33 in section 110.1, subsection 2, paragraphs "b" and "e", and
34 the wild turkey hunting license fees specified in section
35 110.1, subsection 2, paragraphs "c" and "f", take effect on

1 July 1, 1991.

2 b. A lifetime license issued before January 1, 1992,
3 pursuant to section 110.1, subsection 1, paragraph "b", Code
4 1991, or section 110.1, subsection 3, paragraph "b", Code
5 1991, and preceding Codes, is valid for the lifetime of the
6 licensee unless sooner suspended or revoked as otherwise
7 provided by law.

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8 Sec. 5. The Code editor may delete the fee amounts in
9 section 110.1 when they are no longer effective.

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EXPLANATION

11 This bill provides for an increase in the annual fees paid
12 for hunting, fishing, trapping, and related licenses in two
13 steps. The first increase will take effect with the 1992
14 license year, and the second step for the 1995 license year.
15 However, the first fee increase for deer hunting licenses and
16 wild turkey hunting licenses takes effect on July 1, 1991.

17 The bill exempts persons raising rock doves and pigeons
18 from obtaining a game breeder's license.

19 The lifetime fishing and the combined lifetime hunting and
20 fishing licenses are repealed as of January 1, 1992, but the
21 licenses issued before January 1, 1992, are valid for the
22 lifetime of the licensee unless sooner suspended or revoked as
23 provided by law.

24 The bill also provides for the issuance, without charge, of
25 a special fishing or combined fishing and hunting license to
26 low-income, permanently disabled residents and to low-income
27 residents who are sixty-five years of age or older.

FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for House File 703 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 703 raises the fees for hunting, fishing, and other licenses and stamps. The increased fee for deer and turkey hunting licenses for residents and non-residents takes effect on July 1, 1991, while the remainder of the first step of the fee increases take effect on January 1, 1992. The second step takes effect on January 1, 1995. The bill eliminates the lifetime license for residents sixty-five years of age or permanently disabled as of January 1, 1992. However, such licenses issued prior to that date will be honored for the life of the license holder. In place of the lifetime license, the bill establishes a free annual license for residents 65 years of age or over or permanently disabled with income below poverty levels.

Assumptions:

1. The number of licenses sold in future years will equal the average licenses sold for the previous three calendar years.
2. 80% of purchasers of licenses who would have been eligible for a lifetime license will continue to purchase annual licenses and they will purchase annual licenses for 4 years.

Fiscal Effect:

Raising hunting, fishing, and other licenses and stamps, along with discontinuing the lifetime license will increase the funds available to the Fish and Game Protection Fund by the following amounts:

The income stream listed above should cover the costs of the Fish and Wildlife Program over the next 8 fiscal years with only minor expenditure reductions in the Program (\$150,000 each year). This assumes that the costs paid from the Fund will inflate a modest 5% per year, and that license sales will equal the average over the past 3 years. The free annual licenses will reduce the amount of new income generated by eliminating the lifetime license. However, the amount of the income reduction cannot be determined at this time.

As used in this subsection, "veteran" means a person who is a resident of Iowa and who served in the armed forces of the United States of America at any time during World War I between the dates of April 6, 1917, and July 2, 1921, World War II between the dates of December 7, 1941, and December 31, 1946, the Korean conflict between the dates of June 27, 1950, and January 31, 1955, or the Vietnam conflict between August 5, 1964, and May 7, 1975, or the Persian Gulf Conflict between August 2, 1990, and the date the president or the congress of the United States declares a permanent cessation of

possibilities, all dates inclusive, and "disabled" means entitled to compensation under the United States Code, title 38, chapter 11.

Sec. 5. Section 110.24, Code 1991, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 17. The department shall issue without charge a special annual fishing or combined hunting and fishing license to residents of this state who are permanently disabled and whose income falls below the federal poverty guidelines as published by the United States department of health and human services or residents of this state who are sixty-five years of age or older and whose income falls below the federal poverty guidelines as published by the United States department of health and human services. The commission shall provide for, by rule, an application to be used by an applicant requesting a permanent disabled status or age status. The commission shall require proof of age, income, and proof of permanent disability.

Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATES.

1. The fees specified in section 3 of this Act are effective for the 1992 license year and each subsequent license year until otherwise provided by the general assembly, except as provided in subsection 2.

2. This Act takes effect on December 15, 1991, except that

a. This section, the deer hunting license fees specified in section 110.1, subsection 2, paragraphs "b" and "c", and the wild turkey hunting license fees specified in section 110.1, subsection 2, paragraphs "c" and "f", take effect on July 1, 1991.

b. A lifetime license issued before January 1, 1992, pursuant to section 110.1, subsection 1, paragraph "b", Code 1991, or section 110.1, subsection 1, paragraph "b", Code 1991, and preceding Codes, is valid for the lifetime of the licensee unless sooner suspended or revoked as otherwise provided by law.

c. The falconry license fee in section 110.1 shall be for three years beginning and ending as provided by rule of the natural resource commission.
