A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the department of natural resources, by
2 providing for the use of unexpended moneys in the fish and
3 game protection fund, and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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SF 150

1 Section 1. USE OF MONEYS REMAINING IN THE STATE FISH AND
2 GAME PROTECTION FUND.

3 Moneys remaining in the state fish and game protection
4 fund, created in section 107.17, during the fiscal year
5 beginning July 1, 1990, which are not specifically
6 appropriated by the general assembly, are appropriated and may
7 be used by the department of natural resources for capital
8 projects and contingencies arising during the fiscal year
9 beginning July 1, 1990. A contingency shall not include any
10 purpose or project which was presented to the general assembly
11 by way of a bill or a proposed bill and which failed to be
12 enacted into law. For the purpose of this section, necessary
13 additional operating moneys for the department of natural
14 resources may be construed as a contingency. Before any of
15 the moneys authorized to be expended by this section are
16 allocated for contingencies, the executive council must
17 determine that a contingency exists and that the contingency
18 was not existent while the general assembly was in session and
19 that the proposed allocation is in the best interest of the
20 state. If a contingency arises or could reasonably be
21 foreseen during the time the general assembly is in session,
22 expenditures for the contingency must be authorized by the
23 general assembly.

24 Sec. 2. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
25 takes effect upon enactment.

26 EXPLANATION

27 This bill provides for the expenditure of moneys remaining
28 in the state fish and game protection fund during the fiscal
29 year beginning July 1, 1990, which are not specifically
30 appropriated by the general assembly. The unexpended moneys
31 may be used by the department of natural resources for capital
32 projects and contingencies.

33 Certain restrictions are placed on the use of the moneys.
34 Moneys cannot be used to support purposes presented in a bill
35 which failed before the general assembly.

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The executive council must approve any contingency expenditure. An expenditure cannot be made to support a contingency which arose or could have been foreseen during the time that the general assembly was in session.
The bill takes effect upon enactment.

AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. USE OF MONEYS REMAINING IN THE STATE FISH AND GAME PROTECTION FUND.

Moneys remaining in the state fish and game protection fund, created in section 107.17, during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1990, which are not specifically appropriated by the general assembly, are appropriated and may be used by the department of natural resources for capital projects and contingencies arising during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1990. A contingency shall not include any purpose or project which was presented to the general assembly by way of a bill or a proposed bill and which failed to be enacted into law. For the purpose of this section, necessary additional operating moneys for the department of natural resources may be construed as a contingency. Before any of the moneys authorized to be expended by this section are allocated for contingencies, the executive council must determine that a contingency exists and that the contingency was not existent while the general assembly was in session and that the proposed allocation is in the best interest of the state. If a contingency arises or could reasonably be foreseen during the time the general assembly is in session, expenditures for the contingency must be authorized by the general assembly.
