1 Section 1. Section 400.1, Code 1991, is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 400.1 APPOINTMENT OF COMMISSION.

4 In cities having a population of eight thousand or over,
5 having a paid fire department or a paid police department, the
6 mayor, one year after each regular municipal election, with
7 the approval of the council, shall appoint three civil service
8 commissioners who shall hold office, one until the first
9 Monday in April of the second year, one until the first Monday
10 in April of the fourth year, and one until the first Monday in
11 April of the sixth year after such appointment, whose
12 successors shall be appointed for a term of six years.

13 For the purpose of determining the population of a city
14 under this section, the federal census conducted in 1980 shall
15 be used. This paragraph is void effective July 1, 2001.

16 EXPLANATION

17 The bill provides that only those cities with a population
18 of 8,000 or more as determined by the federal census conducted
19 in 1980 shall be subject to the civil service provisions of
20 chapter 400. Accordingly, under the bill, cities with
21 populations which went over 8,000 as a result of the 1990
22 federal census or any subsequent federal census are not
23 required to appoint civil service commissions. Use of the
24 1980 federal census to determine population shall be void
25 effective July 1, 2001.

AN ACT

RELATING TO CITIES SUBJECT TO CIVIL SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 400.1, Code 1991, is amended to read as follows:

400.1 APPOINTMENT OF COMMISSION.

In cities having a population of eight thousand or over, having a paid fire department or a paid police department, the mayor, one year after each regular municipal election, with the approval of the council, shall appoint three civil service commissioners who shall hold office, one until the first Monday in April of the second year, one until the first Monday in April of the fourth year, and one until the first Monday in April of the sixth year after such appointment, whose successors shall be appointed for a term of six years.
