SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Joint Resolution authorizing the temporary use and consumption
2 of alcoholic beverages in the state capitol in conjunction
3 with the 1992 Annual Meeting of the Council of State
4 Governments.

5 WHEREAS, for the first time in the 60-year history of the
6 Council of State Governments, the state of Iowa has the honor of
7 having been selected to host the 1992 Annual Meeting of the
8 Council of State Governments in Des Moines from December 3-6,
9 1992; and

10 WHEREAS, this prestigious national meeting offers an
11 opportunity for the nation's key leaders of both the public and
12 private sectors to address the major issues facing state
13 government in the 1990s and beyond; and

14 WHEREAS, social events are held in conjunction with the
15 business sessions of this annual meeting, and Iowa's unique State
16 Capitol is an optimal location for one of the social events for
17 this national meeting; and

18 WHEREAS, wine and other alcoholic beverages with an alcohol
19 content of more than five percent by weight are customarily
20 served as an accompaniment to the food and entertainment provided
21 at such social events; and

22 WHEREAS, under 401 IAC 1.6(6), which prohibits the consumption
23 of alcoholic beverages on the capitol complex, it is not possible
24 to serve wine and other alcoholic beverages at social events in
25 the State Capitol; NOW THEREFORE,

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding 401 IAC 1.6(6) and any contrary

6 Cooperation established in section 283.1, if the person
7 holding a contract with the Iowa Commission on Interstate
8 Cooperation for providing food and beverages at the social
9 event possesses the appropriate valid liquor control license.

EXPLANATION

11 This joint resolution provides that the rule of the
12 department of general services that prohibits consumption of
13 alcoholic beverages on the capitol complex and any contrary
14 provisions of the Iowa alcoholic beverage control Act are
15 waived for a social event at the state capitol held in
16 conjunction with the 1992 annual meeting of the council of
17 state governments, sponsored by the Iowa interstate
18 cooperation commission. The person providing the food and
19 beverages must possess the appropriate liquor control license.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 2009

A JOINT RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE TEMPORARY USE AND CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN THE STATE CAPITOL IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE 1992 ANNUAL MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF STATE GOVERNMENTS.

WHEREAS, for the first time in the 60-year history of the Council of State Governments, the state of Iowa has the honor of having been selected to host the 1992 Annual Meeting of the Council of State Governments in Des Moines from December 3-6, 1992; and

WHEREAS, this prestigious national meeting offers an opportunity for the nation's key leaders of both the public and private sectors to address the major issues facing state government in the 1990s and beyond; and

WHEREAS, social events are held in conjunction with the business sessions of this annual meeting, and Iowa's unique State Capitol is an optimal location for one of the social events for this national meeting; and

WHEREAS, wine and other alcoholic beverages with an alcohol content of more than five percent by weight are customarily served as an accompaniment to the food and entertainment provided at such social events; and

WHEREAS, under 401 IAC 1.6(6), which prohibits the consumption of alcoholic beverages on the capitol complex, it is not possible to serve wine and other alcoholic beverages at social events in the State Capitol; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Notwithstanding 401 IAC 1.6(6) and any contrary provisions of chapter 123, alcoholic beverages may be used and consumed within the State Capitol at a social event, to be held between December 3, 1992, and December 5, 1992, organized in whole or in part by the Iowa Commission on Interstate

Cooperation established in section 28B.1, if the person holding a contract with the Iowa Commission on Interstate Cooperation for providing food and beverages at the social event possesses the appropriate valid liquor control license.
