DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1994, and ending June 30, 1995, the following amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

1. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

It is the intent of the general assembly that for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1994, and ending June 30, 1995, the department of education shall allocate the same amount for the autism regional program as was allocated by the department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1993.

For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

It is the intent of the general assembly that the division of vocational rehabilitation services of the department of education shall seek, in addition to state appropriations, funds other than federal funds, which may include but are not limited to local funds, for purposes of matching federal vocational rehabilitation funds.

1 Notwithstanding the full-time equivalent position limit
2 established in this subsection for the fiscal year ending June
3 30, 1995, if federal funding is available to pay the costs of
4 additional employees for the vocational rehabilitation
5 division who would have duties relating to vocational
6 rehabilitation services paid for through federal funding,

13 of pregnancy with the intention other than to produce a live-
14 born infant or to remove a dead fetus, and a medically

18 pregnancy would endanger the life of the pregnant woman.

19 (2) The attending physician certifies that the fetus is
20 physically deformed, mentally deficient, or afflicted with a
21 congenital illness.

22 (3) The pregnancy is the result of a rape which is
23 reported within 45 days of the incident to a law enforcement
24 agency or public or private health agency which may include a
25 family physician.

26 (4) The pregnancy is the result of incest which is
27 reported within 150 days of the incident to a law enforcement
28 agency or public or private health agency which may include a
29 family physician.

30 (5) The abortion is a spontaneous abortion, commonly known
31 as a miscarriage, wherein not all of the products of
32 conception are expelled.

33 The total quota allocated to the counties for indigent

7 notes, bonds, or other evidences of indebtedness issued under
8 section 262.48 to finance projects that will result in energy
9 cost savings in an amount that will cause the state board to
10 recover the cost of the projects within an average of six
11 years.

12 Sec. 10. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1994, and
13 ending June 30, 1995, the department of human services shall
14 continue the supplemental disproportionate share and a
15 supplemental indirect medical education adjustment applicable
16 to state-owned acute care hospitals with more than 500 beds
17 and shall reimburse qualifying hospitals pursuant to that
18 adjustment with a supplemental amount for services provided
19 medical assistance recipients. The adjustment shall generate
20 supplemental payments intended to equal the state
21 appropriation made to a qualifying hospital for treatment of
22 indigent patients as provided in chapter 255. To the extent
23 of the supplemental payments, a qualifying hospital shall,
24 after receipt of the funds, transfer to the department of
25 human services an amount equal to the actual supplemental
26 payments that were made in that month. The aggregate amounts
27 for the fiscal year shall not exceed the state appropriation
28 made to the qualifying hospital for treatment of indigent
29 patients as provided in chapter 255. The department of human
30 services shall deposit the portion of these funds equal to the
31 state share in the department's medical assistance account and
32 the balance shall be credited to the general fund of the
33 state. To the extent that state funds appropriated to a
34 qualifying hospital for the treatment of indigent patients as
35 provided in chapter 255 have been transferred to the

1 department of human services as a result of these supplemental
2 payments made to the qualifying hospital, the department shall
3 not, directly or indirectly, recoup the supplemental payments
4 made to a qualifying hospital for any reason, unless an
5 equivalent amount of the funds transferred to the department
6 of human services by a qualifying hospital pursuant to this
7 provision is transferred to the qualifying hospital by the
8 department.

9 If the state supplemental amount allotted to the state of
10 Iowa for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1994,
11 and ending September 30, 1995, pursuant to section 1923 (f)(3)
12 of the federal Social Security Act, as amended, or pursuant to
13 federal payments for indirect medical education is greater
14 than the amount necessary to fund the federal share of the
15 supplemental payments specified in the preceding paragraph,
16 the department of human services shall increase the
17 supplemental disproportionate share or supplemental indirect
18 medical education adjustment by the lesser of the amount
19 necessary to utilize fully the state supplemental amount or
20 the amount of state funds appropriated to the state university
21 of Iowa general education fund and allocated to the university
22 for the college of medicine. The state university of Iowa
23 shall transfer from the allocation for the college of medicine
24 to the department of human services, on a monthly basis, an
25 amount equal to the additional supplemental payments made
26 during the previous month pursuant to this paragraph. A
27 qualifying hospital receiving supplemental payments pursuant
28 to this paragraph that are greater than the state
29 appropriation made to the qualifying hospital for treatment of
30 indigent patients as provided in chapter 255 shall be
31 obligated as a condition of its participation in the medical
32 assistance program to transfer to the state university of Iowa
33 general education fund on a monthly basis an amount equal to
34 the funds transferred by the state university of Iowa to the
35 department of human services. To the extent that state funds

1 appropriated to the state university of Iowa and allocated to
2 the college of medicine have been transferred to the
3 department of human services as a result of these supplemental
4 payments made to the qualifying hospital, the department shall
5 not, directly or indirectly, recoup these supplemental
6 payments made to a qualifying hospital for any reason, unless
7 an equivalent amount of the funds transferred to the
8 department of human services by the state university of Iowa
9 pursuant to this paragraph is transferred to the qualifying
10 hospital by the department.

11 Continuation of the supplemental disproportionate share and
12 supplemental indirect medical education adjustment shall
13 preserve the funds available to the university hospital for
14 medical and surgical treatment of indigent patients as
15 provided in chapter 255 and to the state university of Iowa
16 for educational purposes at the same level as provided by the
17 state funds initially appropriated for that purpose.

18 The department of human services shall, in any compilation
19 of data or other report distributed to the public concerning
20 payments to providers under the medical assistance program,
21 set forth reimbursements to a qualifying hospital through the
22 supplemental disproportionate share and supplemental indirect
23 medical education adjustment as a separate item and shall not
24 include such payments in the amounts otherwise reported as the
25 reimbursement to a qualifying hospital for services to medical
26 assistance recipients.

27 For purposes of this section, "supplemental payment" means
28 a supplemental payment amount paid for medical assistance to a
29 hospital qualifying for that payment under this section.

30 EXPLANATION

31 The bill appropriates moneys from the state general fund to
32 the department of education, the college student aid
33 commission, the state board of regents and its institutions,
34 and the department of cultural affairs.

35 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION -- Under the bill, moneys are

1 appropriated for purposes of the department of education's
2 general administration, vocational education administration,
3 vocational rehabilitation division, independent living, the
4 board of educational examiners, school food service, textbooks
5 of nonpublic school pupils, the vocational agriculture youth
6 organization and for other youth activities, the state
7 library, regional library, center for assessment, technology
8 commission, the Iowa minority academic grants for economic
9 success program, the public broadcasting division, and
10 community colleges.

11 Under the bill, the technology commission receives a 50
12 percent increase over fiscal year 1993-1994 funding, while
13 independent living receives the next largest increase, 4.9
14 percent. Community colleges see an increase of approximately
15 3 percent over fiscal year 1993-1994 under the bill. The
16 amount appropriated to the department's general administration
17 reflects an increase of 1.2 percent above the amount the
18 department received in fiscal year 1993-1994.

19 COLLEGE STUDENT AID COMMISSION -- The bill appropriates
20 moneys to the commission for general administration purposes,
21 for forgivable loans to Iowa students attending the university
22 of osteopathic medicine and health sciences, for an initiative
23 to direct primary care physicians to shortage areas in the
24 state, for student aid programs, and for the Stafford loan
25 program. Funds for the primary care initiative are increased
26 by 49 percent over the fiscal year 1993-1994 appropriation
27 under the bill. A provision of the bill requires that all
28 moneys appropriated for state scholarships be awarded to
29 eligible students, and eliminates a commission-imposed cap on
30 scholarship funding. Statutory language in the bill increases
31 the tuition grant standing appropriation by 2.8 percent.

32 STATE BOARD OF REGENTS -- The bill appropriates moneys to
33 the state board of regents for board operations, tuition
34 replacement, the southwest Iowa graduate center, the tristate
35 graduate center, the quad-cities graduate center, and for the

1 state university of Iowa, Iowa state university of science and
2 technology, the university of northern Iowa, the state school
3 for the deaf, the Iowa Braille and sight saving school, and
4 for tuition and transportation cost for students residing in
5 the Iowa Braille and sight saving school and the school for
6 the deaf. A statutory provision in the bill directs the board
7 to authorize the institutions of higher learning under its
8 control to charge an interest rate, which does not exceed the
9 current fair market interest rate, on delinquent bills.

10 Moneys for tuition replacement are increased over fiscal
11 year 1993-1994 at 9.5 percent under the bill. Funding for the
12 primary health care initiative at the state university of Iowa
13 receives an increase of 38.5 percent over fiscal year 1993-
14 1994. Iowa state university's agricultural experiment station
15 receives an increase of 11 percent over fiscal year 1993-1994
16 under the bill, but the allocation for the university's
17 Leopold Center is decreased by 17.9 percent from the amount
18 allocated in fiscal year 1993-1994. Tuition and
19 transportation for students residing at the Iowa braille and
20 sight saving school and the school for the deaf are increased
21 by 63.7 percent over the fiscal year 1993-1994 allocation
22 under the bill.

23 DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS -- The bill funds the
24 department's administration, the Iowa arts council, the
25 historical division, historic sites, and community cultural
26 grants at the same levels as fiscal year 1993-1994.

27 The bill continues funding for the new Iowa schools
28 development corporation at fiscal year 1993-1994 levels.
29 Statutory language within the bill strikes provisions relating
30 to the statewide caucus on arts and cultural enhancement. The
31 bill repeals the chapter that creates the higher education
32 strategic planning council.
