A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the recovery by the department of public
2 safety of costs associated with the cleanup of a clandestine
3 laboratory site.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 419

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 124C.1 DEFINITIONS.

2 As used in this section, unless the context clearly
3 requires otherwise:

4 1. "Clandestine laboratory site" means a location or
5 operation, including but not limited to buildings or vehicles
6 equipped with glassware, heating devices, and precursors or
7 related reagents and solvents needed to unlawfully prepare or
8 manufacture controlled substances defined in chapter 124.

9 2. "Cleanup" means actions necessary to contain, collect,
10 control, identify, analyze, disassemble, treat, remove or
11 otherwise disperse all substances and materials, including but
12 not limited to those found to be hazardous waste as defined in
13 section 455B.411 and controlled substances defined in chapter
14 124, including contamination caused by those chemicals or
15 substances.

16 3. "Commissioner" means the commissioner of public safety.

17 4. "Department" means the department of public safety.

18 5. "Hazardous substance" means any substance or mixture of
19 substances that presents a danger to the public health or
20 safety and includes, but is not limited to, a substance that
21 is toxic, corrosive, or flammable, and other substances
22 defined in rules adopted pursuant to section 455B.381 and
23 controlled substances as defined in chapter 124.

24 6. "Person having control over a clandestine laboratory
25 site" means a person who at any time possesses, produces,
26 handles, stores, uses, transports, or disposes of a hazardous
27 substance or controlled substance used or intended for use at
28 a clandestine laboratory site. A person having control over a
29 clandestine laboratory site does not include persons
30 performing duties listed in section 124C.2 at the direction of
31 the commissioner and does not include a person who is the
32 owner of the property in or upon which the clandestine
33 laboratory site is located unless the person knew or
34 reasonably should have known that a clandestine laboratory
35 existed in or upon the person's property.

1 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 124C.2 POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE
2 COMMISSIONER.

3 1. The commissioner or the commissioner's designee may use
4 funds appropriated or otherwise available to the department
5 for the following purposes:

6 a. Administrative services for the identification,
7 assessment, and cleanup of clandestine laboratory sites.

8 b. Payments to other government agencies or private
9 contractors for services consistent with the management and
10 cleanup of a clandestine laboratory site.

11 c. Emergency response activities involving clandestine
12 laboratory sites, including surveillance, entry, security,
13 cleanup, and disposal.

14 The commissioner may request the assistance of other state,
15 federal, and local agencies as necessary.

16 2. The commissioner shall proceed, pursuant to this
17 section, to collect all costs incurred in cleanup of a
18 clandestine laboratory site from the person having control
19 over a clandestine laboratory site. No property of the person
20 having control shall be exempt from use for the payment of the
21 costs incurred in cleanup. This collection shall take
22 precedence over any other seizure or forfeiture provided for
23 by Iowa law.

24 3. The commissioner shall make all reasonable efforts to
25 recover the full amount of moneys expended, through litigation
26 or otherwise. Moneys recovered shall be deposited with the
27 treasurer of state and credited to the department of public
28 safety.

29 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 124C.3 LIABILITY TO THE STATE.

30 A person having control over a clandestine laboratory site
31 shall be strictly liable to the state for all of the
32 following:

33 1. The reasonable costs incurred by the state as a result
34 of cleanup of the site.

35 2. The reasonable costs incurred by the state to evacuate

1 people from the area threatened by the clandestine laboratory
2 site.

3 3. The reasonable damages to the state for the injury to,
4 destruction of, or loss of natural resources resulting from
5 the clandestine laboratory site, including the costs of
6 assessing the injury, destruction, or loss.

7 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 124C.4 CLAIM OF STATE.

8 1. An amount for which a person having control over a
9 clandestine laboratory is liable to the state shall constitute
10 a lien in favor of the state upon all property and rights to
11 property, real and personal, belonging to that person. This
12 lien shall attach at the time the charges set out in section
13 124C.3 become due and payable and shall continue for ten years
14 from the time the lien attaches unless sooner released or
15 otherwise discharged. The lien may be extended, within ten
16 years from the date the lien attaches by filing a notice with
17 the appropriate county official of the appropriate county and
18 from the time of filing the lien shall be extended as to the
19 property in that county for ten years, unless sooner released
20 or otherwise discharged, with no limit on the number of
21 extensions.

22 2. In order to preserve the lien against subsequent
23 mortgagees, purchasers, or judgment creditors for value and
24 without notice of the lien, the commissioner shall file with
25 the recorder of the county in which the property is located a
26 notice of the lien. A laboratory cleanup lien shall be
27 recorded in the index of income tax liens in the county.

28 3. Each notice of lien shall be endorsed with the day,
29 hour, and minute when the notice was received, the notice
30 shall be preserved, indexed in the index book, and recorded in
31 the manner provided for recording real estate mortgages. The
32 lien shall be effective from the time of its indexing. The
33 department shall pay a recording fee as provided by section
34 331.604 for the recording of the lien or for its satisfaction.

35 4. Upon payment of a charge for which the commissioner has

1 filed a notice of lien with a county, the commissioner shall
2 immediately file with the county a satisfaction of the charge
3 and the satisfaction of the charge shall be indicated on the
4 index.

5 The attorney general, upon the request of the commissioner,
6 shall bring an action at law or in equity, without bond, to
7 enforce payment of any charges or penalties, and in such
8 action the attorney general shall have the assistance of the
9 county attorney of the county in which the action is pending.

10 The remedies available to the state in this chapter shall
11 be cumulative and no action taken by the commissioner or
12 attorney general shall be construed to be an election on the
13 part of the state to pursue any remedy to the exclusion of any
14 other remedy provided by law.

15 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 124C.5 LIABILITY OF STATE EMPLOYEES
16 OR PERSONS PROVIDING CLEANUP ASSISTANCE.

17 The state and its officers or employees are not liable for
18 damages or injury caused by a condition at a clandestine
19 laboratory site or resulting from action or inaction taken by
20 any officers or employees when acting in their official
21 capacity pursuant to this chapter, unless the damage or injury
22 resulted from intentional wrongdoing or gross negligence.

23 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 124C.6 LEGAL REMEDIES.

24 This chapter does not deny a person any legal or equitable
25 rights, remedies, or defenses, or affect any legal
26 relationship other than the legal relationship between the
27 state and a person having control over a clandestine
28 laboratory site.

29 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 124C.7 RULEMAKING AUTHORITY.

30 The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A
31 necessary to administer this chapter.

32 EXPLANATION

33 This bill authorizes the commissioner of the department of
34 public safety to recover the costs associated with clandestine
35 laboratory sites producing controlled substances.

1 Section 1 provides definitions for terms used.
2 Section 2 defines the powers and duties of the commissioner
3 of the department of public safety in directing assistance to
4 the cleanup of a laboratory site.
5 Section 3 states that persons having control of a
6 clandestine laboratory site unlawfully manufacturing a
7 controlled substance shall be liable to the state for costs
8 incurred of cleanup of site.
9 Section 4 outlines the means by which the state may make
10 its claim via a lien upon property, real and personal,
11 belonging to the person.
12 Section 5 limits the liability of state employees or
13 persons providing cleanup assistance.
14 Section 6 provides that the legal rights of persons other
15 than the state and the person having control of a clandestine
16 lab site are not affected by this chapter.
17 Section 7 relates to rulemaking authority of the
18 department.
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HOUSE FILE 419
FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for House File 419 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 419 authorizes the Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to recover the costs associated with the cleanup of clandestine laboratory sites from persons in control of such sites.

Assumptions

Currently, the federal Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) does the cleanup of the majority of clandestine laboratory sites. However, with the continued increase in methamphetamine labs, DEA will not be available to respond in a timely manner to all cases, resulting in an increased number of cases handled by the DPS.

The DPS stated that the cost of cleanup will vary significantly from case to case, depending on the type of cleanup that is required. Cleanups have ranged in cost from \$6,000 to \$75,000 per case.

The DPS anticipates 12 clandestine lab cleanups in FY 1994, in which DEA will not be involved, at an average cost of \$12,500 per cleanup.

Fiscal Effect

The DPS estimates an annual State cost of \$150,000 for the destruction and cleanup of clandestine lab sites. This cost will exist regardless of the enactment of this legislation. House File 419 allows the Department to make all reasonable efforts to recover this cost from the person(s) having control over the clandestine lab site.

- b. Payments to other government agencies or private contractors for services consistent with the management and cleanup of a clandestine laboratory site.
- c. Emergency response activities involving clandestine laboratory sites, including surveillance, entry, security, cleanup, and disposal.

The commissioner may request the assistance of other state, federal, and local agencies as necessary.

This chapter does not deny a person any legal or equitable rights, remedies, or defenses, or affect any legal relationship other than the legal relationship between the state and a person having control over a clandestine laboratory site.

Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 124C.7 RULEMAKING AUTHORITY.

The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A necessary to administer this chapter.
