A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the establishment of a special classification
2 residential care facility category for persons with physical
3 disabilities.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 584

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 135L.1 DEFINITIONS.

2 As used in the chapter, unless the context otherwise
3 requires:

4 1. "Department" means the department of inspections and
5 appeals.

6 2. "Physical disability" means a physical impairment that
7 results in significant functional limitations in one or more
8 areas of major life activity and in the need for specialized
9 care, treatment, or training services of extended duration.

10 3. "Residential care facility" means residential care
11 facility as defined in section 135C.1.

12 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 135L.2 FACILITIES -- PERSONS WITH
13 PHYSICAL DISABILITIES.

14 1. The department shall establish by rule, in accordance
15 with chapter 17A, a special classification within the
16 residential care facility category for facilities established
17 by nonprofit corporations whose members will be residents of
18 the facility established and which are intended to serve five
19 or fewer residents with a physical disability. A facility
20 within the special classification established pursuant to this
21 chapter is exempt from the requirements of section 135.63. A
22 facility established under this chapter shall comply with both
23 of the following conditions:

24 a. A facility under the special classification shall
25 comply with rules adopted by the department for the special
26 classification.

27 b. A facility shall be located in an area zoned for single
28 or multiple-family housing or in an unincorporated area and
29 shall be constructed in compliance with applicable local
30 requirements and the rules adopted for the special
31 classification by the state fire marshal in accordance with
32 the concept of the least restrictive environment for the
33 facility residents. The rules shall provide authorization for
34 the corporation to design, modify, or construct a specific
35 facility to provide appropriate services and support to the

1 residents of the specific facility. Local requirements shall
2 not be more restrictive than the rules adopted for the special
3 classification by the state fire marshal and the state
4 building code requirements for single-family or multiple-
5 family housing.

6 2. The department shall adopt rules to provide all of the
7 following:

8 a. Technical assistance provided through the office of the
9 attorney general to persons with physical disabilities in
10 forming private nonprofit corporations pursuant to chapter
11 504A as a basis for ownership, management, and operation of
12 the facilities established under this chapter. The technical
13 assistance shall include assistance in securing capital for
14 the purchase, renovation, modification, or construction of
15 residential facilities for persons with physical disabilities.

16 b. Authorization of the corporation to contract for or
17 employ staff for personal attendant needs and for the
18 management and operation of the facility.

19 c. Authorization of the corporation to purchase, modify,
20 maintain, and operate transportation services for the use of
21 facility residents.

22 3. Chapter 504A applies to a nonprofit corporation
23 incorporated to establish a facility under this chapter
24 including the provision relating to limitation of personal
25 liability pursuant to section 504A.101.

26 4. Facilities established under this chapter shall be
27 eligible for funding utilized by other licensed residential
28 care facilities including funding provided through federal,
29 state, and county funding sources.

30 5. Notwithstanding any other licensing requirements under
31 chapter 135C, a facility established under this chapter is not
32 subject to licensure or requirements relating to care review
33 committees pursuant to section 135C.25. The department shall
34 inspect a facility prior to initial operation of the facility,
35 and thereafter only following the receipt by the department of

1 a complaint. Rules applicable to residential care facilities,
2 however, shall be applied to facilities established under this
3 chapter only for the purpose of the investigation of
4 complaints, and sanctions applicable under chapter 135C apply
5 following the investigation of a complaint.

6 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 335.32 HOMES FOR PERSONS WITH
7 PHYSICAL DISABILITIES.

8 A county board of supervisors or county zoning commission
9 shall consider a home for persons with physical disabilities a
10 family home, as defined in section 335.25, for the purposes of
11 zoning, in accordance with chapter 135L, and may establish
12 limitations regarding the proximity of one proposed home to
13 another.

14 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 414.30 HOMES FOR PERSONS WITH
15 PHYSICAL DISABILITIES.

16 A city council or city zoning commission shall consider a
17 home for persons with physical disabilities a family home, as
18 defined in section 414.22, for purposes of zoning in
19 accordance with chapter 135L, and may establish limitations
20 regarding the proximity of one proposed home to another.

21 Sec. 5. FEDERAL WAIVER. The department of human services
22 shall, if necessary, request a waiver from the secretary of
23 the United States department of health and human services to
24 permit the continuation of medical assistance eligibility to
25 residents of a special classification residential care
26 facility for persons with physical disabilities and the
27 reimbursement of a facility provider as a residential care
28 facility.

29 EXPLANATION

30 This bill requires the department of inspections and
31 appeals to establish, by rule, a special classification within
32 the residential care facility category for facilities for
33 persons with physical disabilities established by nonprofit
34 corporations, whose members will be residents of the facility
35 established. The bill requires the office of the attorney

1 general to provide technical assistance to persons wishing to
2 establish corporations for the purpose of establishing the
3 facilities, and authorizes the corporation to purchase and
4 operate transportation services for use of the residents,
5 employ staff, and construct a facility which provides the
6 least restrictive environment for the facility residents. The
7 bill makes the provisions applicable to nonprofit corporations
8 applicable to the corporations establishing the facilities,
9 including the provision relating to limitation of personal
10 liability. The bill provides that the facilities are eligible
11 for federal, state, and county funds available to other
12 residential care facilities, provides that the homes are to be
13 considered family homes for the purposes of zoning, and
14 directs the department of human services to request a waiver
15 from the secretary of the United States department of health
16 and human services to permit continuation of medical
17 assistance eligibility to residents of the facilities and
18 reimbursement of a facility provider as a residential care
19 facility as applicable.

Section 1. NEW SECTION. 504C.1 HOUSING -- PERSONS WITH
PHYSICAL DISABILITIES.

1. For the purposes of this chapter, "physical disability" means a physical impairment that results in significant functional limitations in one or more areas of major life activity and in the need for specialized care, treatment, or training services of extended duration.

2. Individuals with physical disabilities may form nonprofit corporations pursuant to chapter 504A for the sole purpose of establishing homes for persons with disabilities which are intended to serve two to five residents who are members of the nonprofit corporation.

3. A nonprofit corporation formed under this section may do any of the following:

a. Design, modify, or construct a specific housing facility to provide appropriate services and support to the residents of the specific housing facility. Local requirements shall not be more restrictive than the rules adopted for a family home, as defined in section 335.25 or

414.22, and the state building code requirements for single-family or multiple-family housing.

b. Contract for or employ staff for personal attendant needs and for the management and operation of the housing facility.

c. Purchase, modify, maintain, and operate transportation services for the use of the housing facility residents.

4. Residents of housing facilities established under this chapter shall be eligible to apply for or continue to receive funding provided through federal, state, and county funding sources, and assets of the members of the nonprofit corporation used in the establishment, management, and operation of the housing facility, including but not limited to provision of services to the residents of the facility, shall not be considered in determining a resident's eligibility for funding provided through sources otherwise available to the resident.
